Personally appeared in open Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions, Peter Maxwell, who being duly sworn deposed, that some time in or about the month of December last, this deponent was called upon by Isaac Hopkins then lying sick at his the said Hopkins' own house, and the said Hopkins being of perfect memory and sound judgment, declared it to be his will and desire that after his decease, after the payment of the just debts by him owing, the remainder of his estate consisting of personal property should remain and be at the disposal and entire property of Sarah his wife, he having no issue.
