

I, Richard Kelly, being ill in health, but of sound mind and memory, do make this my last will and Testament in manner following to say,

I give unto my mother, Ann Kelly, all my property, of what ever description, which as well as I recollect, consists of two trunks of clothes, and what debts may be due me. Should any monies be received from the assignees of John Barclay, on whom I have a claim for five hundred and seventy five pounds sterling, for bills of exchange, which bills are protested, and the damages and interest to be added thereto, the same to be paid to the order of said Ann. The amount of an apportionment made me by James Carson for two hundred pounds sterling, when paid will be to be deducted from the above sum, and same paid to the order of said Ann my mother. There is in the hands of C. Jones esq, an execution in my favor of £40 for forty one dollars or thereabouts, which when paid, I wish to be paid to the Executors or Administrators of Mathew Curran dec^d. Lastly, I appoint John Brown and John MacAuslan my Executors to this my will.
