expences be fully paid and satisfied; and what remains of my
estate both real and personal I give, devise and bequeath unto my
cousins James McCracken, Ann the wife of John Richardson, and
Jane McCracken sisters to the said James McCracken, of the County
of Orange in the province aforesaid; To hold to them my said
cousins part and share alike, their several and respective heirs,
executors and assigns forever, to be equally divided between them
And I nominate and appoint my trusty friends William Campbell
Esq, and John Roberson Merchants, both of the Borough of Wilmington to
be the Executors of this (hereby revoking all other or former and decla-
ring this to be) my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of March
in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty six,

In the name of God Amen.
I William Morris of the County of New Hanover, in the Province
foresaid, planter, being sick and weak of body, but of
perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, prin-
cipally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands
of God that gave it, and my body to the earth to be buried
in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors
and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in
manner and form following: Bist-
Impium. It is my will that all my just debts and funeral exp-
ences be paid immediately after my decease.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my grandson James Morris, son
of Thomas Morris deceased and to the heirs male of his body
lawfully issuing, forever, the plantation and tract of land where
I now dwell, containing five hundred and twenty acres more or
less, situate on New Ipswich Sound in the County of New Hanover in
the Province aforesaid, and in case the said James Morris shall
die without issue as aforesaid, that then and in such case I
give the said plantation and tract of land to my grandson
William Morris son of my daughter Margaret Morris and to
the heirs male of his body lawfully issuing, forever. And in case
he the said William Morris shall die without such issue as aforesaid
that then and in such case I give the said plantation and tract
of land to my grandson Thomas Bishop son of my daughter
Elizabeth Bishop to him and his heirs forever.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Bishop
to her and her heirs, one negro man named Hector, and one
negro man named Pomp.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Morris
to her and her heirs one negro man named London, to be deliv-
ered her when she goes to Georgia.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Mc Lannum, twenty
pounds proclamation money, and three cows and calves, to be paid
and delivered her, immediately.
