of sound mind, but sick and weak, of body, do make this my last
will and Testament, in manner following,
First. I recommend my body to the earth to be decently interred, and
my soul to my eternal maker with perfect resignation.
I give and bequeath all and whatsoever property that may belong
to me at the time of my decease, unto Mr Joshua Potts; and do
hereby constitute and appoint him my executor, witness my
hand and seal at Wilmington this 10th day of October, 1794.

The last will and Testament of Thomas Flowers, was proved in
Court at November Term 1794 by Robert Harley the subscribing
witness; at the same time Joshua Potts therein named, qualified
as Executor thereto.

In the name of God Amen. I Sarah Hoyout being
weak and infirm of body, but of a sound disposing mind and
memory, do make and ordain this to be my last will and Test-
ament.
I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Betsey, one large ring set
with stone, one breast pin and one plain ring.
And to my daughter, Nancy, my large locket and the blue and
white set of curtains; but in case my said daughter should die
under age, then I give and bequeath my said locket to Mr. Jos. Fergus
Jury, to be worn by him in remembrance of me.
It is my will and desire that my Executors hereinafter named,
should sell and dispose of my household furniture and other
articles of personal property (my plate and negroes excepted) as soon
as convenient after my decease. My negroes Homer, Betty and her
children to be hired out by my Executors for the benefit of my children.
I request and desire my Executors to give to Miss Dolly East a suit of

second mourning.

To my daughters Betsey and Nancy, I give and bequeath all my estate both real and personal, to be equally divided between them after the payment of my just debts, and I hereby nominate and appoint my brother Hugh Campbell, Doctor Armand, John DeKoper and Joshua G Wright, Executors to this my last Will and Testament, revoking and making void all former wills, recommending my children to the particular attention of my said Executors and to my friends Mrs Randal and her daughter Miss Nancy Randal. Witness my hand and seal April 20th 1798.
