the town of Wilmington State of North Carolina, being  
of sound and disposing mind, in view of death that  
comes to all do ordain make & publish this my last  
will & testament.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I bequeath & devise to Dr. Edwin A. Anderson  
& William B. Flanner of the town aforesaid my brick-  
house on Market Street in said town, now occupied by  
Mr. De Neale to them & their heirs forever. In trust that  
they will apply the rents & profits of said house to the  
use of my mother during the term of her natural life,  
& after her death, then to the use of Elizabeth Smith  
my adopted daughter & Eliza M. Albertson, daughter  
of Mr. McAlhenny & his wife Sarah Cowan, & their  
heirs, executors & administrators forever?

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I bequeath & devise to the said Anderson &  
the said Flanner & their heirs forever the brick house  
on Market Street in which I now reside & all the fur-  
niture apparel & in said house and kitchen attached  
In trust that they will apply the same & the rents & profits  
arising from the same to the use & benefit of the said  
Elizabeth Smith my adopted daughter as aforesaid.  
her heir, executors & administrators forever.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give bequeath & devise to the said Flanner  
& the said Anderson & their heirs forever all my real  
estate on Chestnut Street in the town aforesaid consist-  
ing of one full lot. In trust for the sole benefit & use of  
Eliza M. Albertson, daughter of Mr. McAlhenny & Sarah  
Cowan his wife, her heirs executors & administrators.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I bequeath & devise all my Rail Road Stocks  
of any & every description to the said Anderson & the said  
Flanner their executors administrators & assigns for the  
sole use & benefit of the said Elizabeth Smith my  
adopted daughter as aforesaid & the said Eliza M.  
Albertson, daughter of Mr. McAlhenny & Sarah Cowan  
his wife, their executors administrators & assigns forever.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> All the remainder of my property real &  
personal I give & devise to the said Anderson & the  
said Flanner, their heirs executors & administrators  
forever. In trust for the use & benefit of the said Elizabeth  
Smith & the said Eliza M. Albertson their heirs, executors  
& administrators.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> It is my will & desire, if the said Elizabeth  
Smith shall continue to lead the life of an abandoned  
woman, or prostitute & to have illegitimate children  
that then the said Anderson & the said Flanner shall  
sell all the property herein bequeathed & devised to the  
said Elizabeth Smith & divide the proceeds of the sale

between the said Eliza M. Albertson & the poor of the  
said town of Wilmington equally share & share alike.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I hereby appoint the said Flanner & the  
said Anderson executors to this my last will & testament.

New Hanover County Court, Decr. Term 1862.

This paper writing, purporting to be the last will and  
testament of Sarah Smith deceased was exhibited  
in open Court, by Wm. P. Flanner, one of the executors  
therin named, and offered for probate, and the due  
execution of the same, by the said Sarah Smith, was  
proved by the oath and examination of G. J. McRee  
and Wilkes Morris, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto,  
and it is considered by the Court, that the said  
paper writing, and every part thereof, is the last will  
and testament of the said Sarah Smith, and suf-  
ficient to convey the bequests therin made, and it is  
ordered that the same be recorded and filed. At the  
same time William P. Flanner one of the executors  
therin named, appeared in open Court, and was  
duly qualified as such.
