I, Sarah Williford of the County of New Hanover, in the State of North Carolina, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, (praised be God for the same), and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst I have strength and capacity so to do, do make and publish this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, And first and principally, I commit my soul into the hands of my Creator, who gave it, and my body to the earth to be interred at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named. And as to such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to interest me, I dispose of the same as followeth, First. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible, out of the first monies that shall come into the hands of my Executors, Second. I give, devise and bequeath all my estate of every description, real, personal, perishable or mixed, consisting of the tract of land wherupon I now reside, conveyed to me by Patent bearing date the ninth day of January, A.D. 1821, by reference to said Patent a particular description of said tract of land can be had, a horse and cart, all my stock of every description, all my household and kitchen furniture, all my right, title, property, claim and demand upon the estate of my deceased brother Jacob James, as one of the next of kin of said Jacob James, being entitled to a share in his estate, of which there has as yet been no division. And all other property of every description of which I may die seized or possessed, and all my right, interest estate, claim and demand of in and to any property, not then in my possession with P. W. Manning and John A. Parker, their heirs, executors and administrators, in trust, nevertheless for the following uses and purposes and intents, and no other, that is to say, for the sole and separate use, benefit and support of my daughter Elizabeth Peacock, (not to be subject to the control of her husband Richard Peacock, and not to be liable for his present or any future debts) during the life of my said daughter, Elizabeth Peacock, and after her death then for the use and benefit of such child or children of my said daughter, Elizabeth as may be living at her death, his, her, or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns. But if my said daughter, Elizabeth should die without leaving a child or children living at her death then for the use and benefit of my son in law Richard Peacock, his

heirs, executors, administrators and assigns,
I have already given to my daughter, Emma Wobloin
wife of Richard Wobloin, all the property I wish her or her
heirs to have,

Thereby appoint J^W Fanning and John A Parker,
Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

unto set my hand and seal as my last Will and Test-
ament this day of in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and forty five,
