he is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this
my last will and Testament, that is to say,
First of all. I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing
doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God.

Secondly. As touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God
to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner, and foond

First. I give and bequeath to my following children, Thomas, John,
Rebecca and Sarah, one Spanish mill dollar, each, as they have
already received a share of me.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to Abel Morgan Jr., all my right to
forty five acres of land, as has been already successed for Abel
Morgan his father, and is the place where he now dwells,

Thirdly. I give to my daughter Anne Beeley, two cows and calves,
one feather bed and furniture for the same.

Fourthly. I give to my two youngest sons Solomon and James Bushy
all my lands that I now own and not already bequeathed, with
all my other property, to them and their heirs to be equally divided between
them.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Kegial Beeley
the rest of my property that I may own at the time of my death after
my just debts are paid, which I request her to pay by the sale
of such of my perishable property as she can best spare: and at
her decease to be equally divided between my two sons Solomon and
James; but should one of them die before he comes to age the whole
deceased of my lands and other property that may be left at the
decease of my wife, to the survivor, one of the two; but should none
of them arrive to the age of twenty one, then I will that the whole of my
lands and other property, be equally divided amongst my other
children: I do also constitute my beloved wife Kegial Beeley my
sole Executrix to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of

November One thousand eight hundred and one
Signed Sealed and declared by the
aforesaid Solomon Beeley as his last Will
and Testament in presence of us
John Spelman, Anne Beeley.

for it, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing
that it is of once appointed for all men once to die; do make and
ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, principally and
First of all, I give and recommit my soul unto God that gave
it; and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner, at the
discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but that I shall receive
the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching my
worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me with
in this life, I give, devise and despose of the following manner
and form.

First. I give and bequeath to Sarah my dearely beloved wife, or
negroe wench Dolly, one bed and furniture, also six cows & scalps
during her widowhood. I also give and bequeath unto my dear
beloved wife Sarah, one mare Lilly, together with all the house
hogs; also the plantation whereon I now live during her widowhood
also all my corn and meat that I now have; then at her death
or marriage to be sold and equally divided amongst my children
then alive.

Also I give to my well beloved daughter, Sarah Batt, one mulatto
girl Molly, also one bed and furniture, to her and her heirs forever.
Also I give unto my well beloved daughter, Mary Batt one negroe boy
Booker, also one bed and furniture, to her, and her, heirs forever,
Also I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son John Batt all
and singular my lands and tenements, also two negroes by the
name of Cleancy and Gabriel, also one horse colt by the name
Anthony, to him and his heirs forever.

Also I give and bequeath unto my well beloved daughter, Zella
Batt, one mulatto boy David, also one hundred Spanish
dollars, to her, and her, heirs forever, by them to be proportioned
And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and
every other former, testaments, wills, legacies, bequeaths, & consecutions
