I Thomas Murray of the County of Ansonia and State of
 North Carolina being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty
 of my earthly existence, do make publish and declare this my last
 Will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say
^{1st} That my executors herein after named shall provide for my body
 a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations & friends
 pay all funeral expenses together with all my just debts, to
 whomsoever owing out of the first money that may come into
 his or their hand, as a part or parcel of my estate.
^{2nd} I hereby desire that my executors purchase for the use and benefit
 of my wife Joanna Murray a Negro girl or woman
 with such part or all of the sum of three thousand dollars
 which I now possess, if any remainder of said sum after
 the purchase of the negro, I wish it to go with the other money
 of my estate.
^{3rd} I will and desire that my executors appropriate all the other
 money of which I may be possessed at the time of my decease to
 the education & support of my wife & children giving to my
 daughter Emily Caroline the sum of two hundred dollars above
 an equal share with my other children, I will and bequeath
 to my wife Mrs Joanna all my lands for and during the
 term of her natural life or widow hood, at her decease
 or marriage to all my children in equal shares, It is my
 will that my wife Mrs Joanna Murray have my stock of all
 kinds farming implements and all the appurtenances & fixtures
 about my plantation, also my household & kitchen furniture to
 be used for the maintenance & support of her self & my children
 during her natural life, at her decease to all my children share
 and share alike equally. In testimony of all which I the said
 Thomas Murray do hereunto set my hand and seal this 18th
 day of July A.D. 1864
 Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Joanna Murray
 and my brother John W Murray my executors & trustees
 to execute this my last will & testament according to the true
 intent and meaning of the same and every part & clause thereof.
