 and I will and bequeath unto the said John and Thomas
 Berry, all and singular every sum or sums of money that
 may be due, owing or in anywise appertaining unto me at the
 time of my decease, the same to be equally divided and shared
 between them both.

and I do hereby constitute and appoint Capt James Jones and
 Lieut Archibald Douglass, and my son John Berry, Executors of
 this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and making
 void all other former wills and Testaments heretofore by me
 made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal this 30th day of July, in the year of our Lord Christ 1742
 at the Camp near Kingston Jamaica.
