I leave to the use of my father, his life time, one house and lot bought
of Mr Waddell; at his death to be divided between my wife Louisa
and my sister, Sally,

The following property I wish sold, viz, One lot bought of Edward
Barge improved with two small houses; one lot bought of John Bowen
improved with one small house; one house built on a lot leased of Paris
Willingham & Son; One share in Navigation Company, (seventy or eighty per
cent) the one half of which I give to Solomon Nash; the other half to be
placed in the hands of the Executors with all other property not spec-
ified above, or all monies that may be due me, to be applied first
to the discharge of all my lawful debts, the balance to be remitted to
my father, as he may need during his life; should there be anything
left at his death, I wish it divided as above between my wife and
sister,

I appoint Lewis Sheridan of Bladen, and Thomas Grimes
of Cumberland, to be executors of this my last Will and Testament.
