In the name of God Amen. I, Thomas Larkins
of the County of New Haven, and State of North Carolina, being
of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed God) on the
seventh day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and nineteen, make and publish this my last Will and
Testament in manner following, that is to say,
First. I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary during her widowhood
all my negroes, viz. Mully, Minda, Mary, Liddy, Chas Hamlet, Charlotte
and Sam. all my land, stock, of every kind and household furniture
If my wife Mary should have an heir by me, then one half of
the above property, I give to it, and after the widowhood of my
wife, the other half of the property, I give and bequeath to my nephew
James Larkins Junr. If my wife should have an heir by me, and
it dies before it becomes of age then I give and bequeath the whole
of my property to my nephew James Larkins and his heirs forever
And I hereby make and ordain my nephew James Larkins Junior
Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof
I the said Thomas Larkins have to this my last Will & Testament,
set my hand and seal this 7th day of January 1819.

In the name of God Amen. I, James Larkins of
 the State of North Carolina and County of New Hanover, do this
 fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
 hundred and twenty two, make my last Will and Testament, in
 manner, and form as follows, to wit,

To the children of my son William Jones Larkins, I do hereby bequeath
 a negro man named Duff, but son William to have the use of said
 negro during his own life.

To my son James Larkins I give a negro man named Jack,

To my son Samuel Jones Larkins I give a negro man named Atto.

To the children of my daughter Margaret Beaud, I give a negro man
 called Handy. It is my will that the value of the above negroes
 should be deducted out of their shares at the division of my estate.

I give to my grandson James L Parish a negro man named
 Jim, as his full share of my estate.

I give to my grand daughter, Margaret Eliza Hawes, a negro girl
 named Betty, as her full share of my estate, but in case the said
 M E Hawes should die before she is fifteen years old, the said negro
 Betty is to return to my heirs.

To my son Samuel Jones Larkins, I give four hundred acres of land
 lying on Riley's creek, patented by James and Benjamin Larkins.
 Also one hundred and sixty acres of land joining the above paten-
 ted by me; the last mentioned piece of land begins on the east side
 of Riley's creek, on the bank, of the creek, on the line of the first mentioned
 piece.

I give to my son John R Larkins the house and plantation where
 I now live containing four hundred and twenty acres patented
 by John Holders and purchased from David Sumner and John
 Devane. Also one hundred and ninety five acres joining the same
 and the land of Thomas Williams decd.

It is my will that my son John Robert should have the privilege
 of cutting necessary ditches through the lands that I have given to my son
 Samuel J Larkins.

I also give to my son John Robert a negro boy named Duff, and an equal
 share with the rest of my heirs. My desire is that my Executors should
 put said negro boy to the blacksmiths trade. I also request my Executors
