I, Thomas Robeson of the town of Wilmington, in the County of New Hanover, and State aforesaid, being in perfect mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in the manner and form following, First. I give my soul to God who gave it me, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner, and touching such worldly estate as I possess, I give and bequeath in the following manner,

First. It is my will and desire, that my Executors after my decease pay all my just debts.

I give to my sister in law, Catharine Robeson my negro girl named Fanny,

I give and bequeath to my nephew John Callender four negroes that is to say my negro woman named Rachel and her three children, John, James and March, to him and his heirs forever,

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catharine Robeson, my house and lot in the town where I now dwell, with all other my lands I do now or may possess at the time of my decease, together with all other my negroes to me belonging not before mentioned, together with all and singular, and every other kind or kinds of property I possess, to my before mentioned and beloved wife Catharine Robeson to her and her heirs forever,

And for the execution of this my last Will, I do hereby appoint and ordain my two beloved friends and brothers in law Thomas Callender, and Richard Nixon my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. And I do hereby revoke, disannul and make void all other Wills and Testaments by me made, ratifying and confirming this and no other, to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seven.
