thereto and as such considered by the Court to be and
contain the last will & Testament of said Catharine
Henry in every respect, and ordered to be re-
corded & filed at the same time C W Murphy
the Executor therein named appeared in open
Court and was duly questioned

If I should die before having made a regular will it is my
desire & will (that that as Julia and Ellen will be left without
any other Expectation) thirty Shares of Commercial Bank Stock
and Seven thousand dollars in Confederate 8% Bonds now
held by me, be divided equally between them, and I desire
that Two thousand five hundred dollars in Stock & Bonds be paid
each my Eliza Edward, & Henry, one Thousand dollars each
to Lizzie Riston & Mary McRae - and should anything remain
of the Stock, and Bonds and money after my few debts and
funeral expenses are paid, I should desire that Richard -
should receive one to Two Thousand dollars, if he should ever
return and need it, if not the bal. money be divided
equally between Eliza, Edward & Henry. The Value of the household
Furniture and servants to be estimated, and divided between
Julia & Ellen March 8th 1864. J Savage

In the event of Julius death I desire that Two thousand & dollars
be paid into the hands of a trustee or trustess, for the benefit of her
children, and in the event of Ellens death before she is married and
has children the amount left to her shall be divided equally between
Elizabeth, Edward and Henry. I should like to remember
Richard, but as I have not heard from him in a long time
I do not know, whether he will ever return to claim anything
I have. if he should, and need it. I request that he have
a share of what may be left, after the foregoing bequest.

The foregoing paper writing purporting to be the last will and Testament of Timothy Savage deceased is exhibited in open Court and offered for probate, and upon the oath & examination of O. G. Parsley, William A. Wright, and Stephen D. Wallace it is considered by the Court that the said paper writing & every part thereof is the last will & Testament of the said Timothy Savage and the same is ordered to be recorded & filed and thereupon Henry Savage, is appointed administrator with the will annexed who is duly qualified as such by giving bond in the sum of Twenty five thousand dollars, with O. G. Parsley & W. L. Latimer as Securities but executed & he duly qualified.

 Know all men by these presents that I James Richardson formerly of the City of Raleigh and State above mentioned, being in a State of feeble health, but of sound mind and memory, and knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do will bequeath and dispose of such worldly goods as it has pleased God to bless me with, after the following form & manner: Viz.
 1st I leave my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors, and after the payment of my debts, I leave to my friend James Dunn Woffham my mattress, bedstead and bedclothing, two large Mahogany framed looking glasses - room furniture and all the crockery in my store at the time of my death. The residue of my estate consisting of Merchandise, Money, bonds, credits, Suits at Law, and every thing else of every description are to be disposed of as follows:
 3rd I leave to my friend William J. Palmer my chronometer
 4th I leave to my friend George W. Woffham all the residue & remains of my estate of every description and kind such as it may be
 5th I hereby revoke and annul all other wills & Testaments, and publish and declare this to be my last will and Testament.

I constitute and appoint James R. Woffham my Executor to carry out my will as expressed in this my last will & Testament, this 30th day of July 1864 the State and County before mentioned.
