In the first place, it is my desire that all my just debts shall be honestly paid; and that the remaining estate real as well as personal, shall devolve to my beloved wife Margaret Gibson and to her heirs or assigns forever; and lest there should be any misinterpretation it is my real intention that any estate whether real or personal that I am lawfully entitled to, shall in like manner, devolve to my said wife, her heirs and assigns forever, as well as what I am now possessed of.

Lastly. I constitute and appoint my said wife Executrix and Arch^d Macclaine esq^r Executor, of this my last Will, which I hereby ratify and confirm this 10th day of June in the year of our Lord 1782, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal sealed, signed and acknowledged
