

In the name of God Amen. I William Barwick,  
New Hanover County, in the State of North Carolina, Planter,  
of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make  
and ordain this my last Will and Testament, in manner, and form  
following: viz:

First, I will that my just debts shall be paid, after, which  
I give and bequeath my personal estate in manner, and form  
following:

I give to my dearly beloved wife Drusilla Barwick,  
the plantation which I now possess known by the name of  
the Brick House Plantation, opposite Rich Inlet, with the lands  
and properties thereunto belonging to her, during her natural  
life; and after her decease, the same lands and properties to  
be the rights of my two sons, namely, James Barwick, and  
White Barwick, to be equally divided between them by three  
freeholders, which of said County, which they shall see fit to  
choose; and in case that either, of them should be disposed  
to sell his part, the other, shall have it on paying him sixty  
pounds current money of said State, in twelve months after  
the said contract or otherwise as they can agree; which land  
I will to them and their heirs lawfully begotten; and in case  
that either, of them should die without heirs, the other, to possess  
the whole lands as above, on paying his two sisters each  
twenty pounds, namely Elizabeth Barwick, and Nancy Barwick,  
being current money of said State; and in case both my sons  
die without heirs, the lands and properties to be equally divi-  
ded between my two daughters Elizabeth Barwick, and Nancy  
Barwick, to them and their heirs forever.

I also give to my dearly beloved wife, two milch cows, and  
a feather bed and furniture belonging to it. I also leave to my said  
wife one work horse, and ten pounds of pewter, and one large  
pot, and one chest, one tea kettle and one Spire Mortar, and  
one pair of hand mill stones.

I give to my dearly beloved daughter, Elizabeth one three  
year old heifer, colored red and white, known by the name  
of the white faced cows heifer, and her increase. I also give to  
my said daughter, Elizabeth one red year, old steer, and one  
other heifer, and ten pounds of pewter.

I give to my dearly beloved daughter, Nancy Barwick  
one heifer, calves, one belonging to the cow, bought of Thomas  
my, and the other, belonging to the black cow, bought at New  
my, and their increase; I also give to my daughter, Nancy,  
one feather bed, and ten pounds of pewter.

I give to my dearly beloved son James Barwick, one red  
white faced cow, and steer, calf, and feathers to make a good bed,

Item. I give to my dear, beloved son White Barwick, two  
one three graft and one four graft; I also give to my said son  
one iron pot and hook, one dictionary, and three breeding sows  
and ten pound of pewter,

Item. I also leave to my dear wife two breeding sows, and one  
pair of Steely axes, and one large bible,

Item. I also give to my son James, one small iron pot and hook  
I also give to my said son James two breeding sows,

Item. I will that all the rest of my personal estate be equally  
divided by three freeholders of said State, between my, dear  
beloved wife and four children, revoking all wills or wills,

In testimony whereof I the said William Barwick, has  
hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June  
anno Domini 1778

The within last Will & Testament  
of William Barwick, was exhibited in Court, and proved by
