In the name of God Amen - I William R Corbett of New Hanover County being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following -

First. I give and bequeath to my son in law Joseph D Rufus and wife Susan R Rufus two negroes viz Matilda and Henry, and Bed and furniture, two Cows & Calves. I do also give and bequeath unto my son David R Corbett two negroes viz Eliza & Suelat and their increase, together with all my real estate

I do also give and bequeath

To my beloved wife Frances two negroes Nancy & Setira, together with all my stock of whatsoever kind, household & kitchen furniture and horse and carriage

And lastly I give my Notes and accounts to my beloved wife Frances to collect and pay my debts

In witness whereof

I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 31st day of August 1846. I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Frances sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Wm R Corbett Seal
