

In the name of God Amen. I William Henry of the State of North Carolina and County of New Hanover do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, being weak in body, but of sound mind, thanks be to God —
 First. I give and bequeath unto Robert Henry my son a piece of land including my plantation —
 Secondly. I give to Andrew M. Henry, a piece of land in the fork of the creek joining Luke Register —
 Also to William Henry, forty five acres of land, the upper piece of my land on the east side of the Creek —
 Also to Alexander James Henry, the lower piece joining William Colvins land —
 Also to Neal and John Henry, the land called formerly the Hoing land; it being their distributive share —
 My daughters Ann, Hannah, Isabella Wiley, to have equal portion of my house, so long as they may live single, with my son Robert —
 My daughter Jane to have ten dollars —
 Margaret Peterson Ten dollars —
 Mary Register and Catharine Mac Allister, also ten dollars each —
 All my stock, of horses, cattle and hogs are to be sold, my debts if any there be shall be paid, and my three daughters Ann, Hannah, Isabella W, to have equal share of the sale of said stock —
 My daughters Ann, Hannah, Isabella W, to have a bed each of them reserved —
 All my plantation tools, household and kitchen furniture to be sold and equally divided between my daughters Ann, Hannah, Isabella W —
 I appoint Robert Henry and Luke Register, sole executors to this my last will and Testament —
 In testimony whereof I have set my hand and seal May 15th 1833.

Codicil to this my last will

 I appoint Robert Henry and Luke Register, sole executors to this

In the name of God Amen. I, John Hambleton of the State of North Carolina and County of New Hanover, having my perfect understanding, but weak, in body, and knowing that all men has to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, and as to my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me.

First. I give and bequeath the plantation where I now live to my son John, containing one hundred and fifty acres; also one hundred and fifty acres of land, lying on Prince George's Creek, holden by Patent.

Secondly. I give and bequeath all the rest of my lands that I now hold by patent or otherwise, to my oldest daughter Elizabeth and my daughter Ann Eliza, to be equally divided between them both.

Thirdly. I will that my five negroes and all my household furniture, my stock of cattle and horses, sheep and hogs and plantation tools, shall continue on the plantation where I now live, and that no division is to take place among my children until after the death of my wife; and I further appoint description and plantation tools of all kinds, shall continue natural life; and after her decease all my perishable property is to be equally divided among my children, and to continue and inure to them and the heirs lawfully begotten of their bodies Amos and Marcus, and two head of horses, all my stock of cattle, sheep and hogs, household and plantation tools,
