I William Jones being of sound mind and memory, thanks be to God, do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making null and void all Wills by me heretofore made, and I do hereby declare this to be and contain my last Will and Testament.

I give and bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave it me, and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named.

I give and bequeath to my two sons Samuel and William all my lands and tenements, to be equally divided between them; and the rest of my estate to be equally divided between my wife and my children.

And lastly. I nominate and appoint Samuel Jones and Francis Jones to be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament, desiring and requesting them to see the same put in execution in testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this third year of our independence Anno Domini December the 6th 1778.

I, Jonathan Isaac of the County of New Hanover, and State of North Carolina, being in perfect health of body and in perfect mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God, calling unto my mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner, and form.

Through and for the sincere friendship and real regard I have for John Murphy, shoemaker, in the State and County aforesaid I constitute make and ordain him sole ^{Heir &} executor of this my last will and Testament, all and singular my moneys, goods and chattels, by him freely to be possessed and enjoyed.

And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former testaments, wills, legacies, bequest and executor by me in any ways before named, written and bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof

I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine. Signed, sealed, published, pronounced and } Jonathan Isaac. Seal
declared by the said Jonathan Isaac as his last
will and Testament, in the presence of us, who in
his presence, and in the presence of each other,
have hereunto subscribed our names.

teenth & seventeenth line from the top.
