

In the name of God Amen. I, William Taylor, shipwright being weak, and sick in body, though of sound mind, memory, and understanding, thanks be to God, do make my last, full and Testament, hereby revoking and disannulling all former, and things by me heretofore made.

Impriously. As I am now and have been sometime before in the house of William Miller, Tavern keeper, in Wilmington, and of course have incurred some expence which I am at present not able to pay, have on that account made over, a bond to him from Robert Simmonds in the parish of Kingston Jamaica, for one hundred and sixty pounds, currency of said Island, which if I should happen to die while I remain in his house and in his debt, he is to indemnify himself with what part of the bond may be his just due. The remainder he is to return to my wife now residing on the Sound near Wilmington known there by the name of Mary Taylor.

I likewise after the payment of my just debts and funeral charges will and bequeath my said wife Mary, not only the reversion of the bond, but all my estate both real and personal of what nature or kind soever.

Lastly. I appoint my sole Executor, James Stevens if he will be so good as to take the trouble of acting, in case he should decline that trouble, I thereby appoint my wife Mary to be my sole Executrix.

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven.
