William Burk's Will

In the name of God Amen, I William Burk of the County of Northampton in the Province of North Carolina, being at present very weak & sick of body, but of perfect sound mind & memory, thanks be to God, but feeling to mend the mortality of my body, do constitute and ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form following. (that is to say)

First I humbly & commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping through the meritorious Cross of my blessed Saviour hoping to have free pardon of all my sins & inherit everlasting life, and as for my body I commit it to the ground from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and as touching all such temporal Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me, I give & dispose of in manner & form following.

Item I give the fourth unto my son William Burk one hundred & fifty acres of land also two Cows Horses & a two year old horse one pewee Dish & a barren, I also give to my son Wm Burk my negro girl named Florah after his mothers decease, I also give to my said son William Burk one feather bed & furniture.

Item I give the fourth unto my daughter Mary Snipes my negro woman named Phillis after her Mothers decease.

Item I give the residue & remainder of my Estate tenements goods & Chattels unto my wife Mary Burk during her natural life and after her decease to be equally divided between my two children Mary Snipes & William Burk, and I do constitute & appoint my beloved friend Joseph Smith my whole sole Executor of this my last will & Testament making due annexing and making void all other wills heretofore by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23rd day of September 1761. Moses Halls Will

Northampton County 3^d Decr known unto all men
 North Carolina } by these presents that I Moses
 Hall being sick very weak of body, but in perfect
 strength of mind & memory, do make & ordain this
 my last will & testament that is to say, I principally
 first of all I give commend my soul into the hands
 of God that gave it, & my body I commit to the earth
 to be decently buried at the discretion of my execu-
 tors hereafter named & as touching such world-
 ly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
 me with in this life, I give demise & dispose of
 the same in the following manner & form;

first I will that all my just debts and I do owe in right or
 conscience to any person whatsoever be well & truly paid,
 or ordained to be paid in convenient time after my
 death by my Executors hereafter named.

Item I give to my dear wife the sole & benefit of my plantation
 during her natural life or widowhood, and after her
 decease or marriage, I give said plantation to my
 son Moses Hall, I give to my son Moses Hall one Colt

Item I give to my wife one feather bed of furniture thereto belong-
 ing of four Cows & calves, & two large hewer barrens two
 large sicks one dozen of water pails half a dozen Earthen
 plates four large milk pans.

Item I give to my son Moses Hall one fair year old steer one
 three year old heifer, one broad axe & one narrow axe.

Item I give to my son Isaac Hall one feather bed of furniture
 thereto belonging, Long Caspers tools except one drawing knife.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Joseph Hall one feather bed of furniture
 therunto belonging one Cow & calf, one year old steer two year old heifer.

Item I give to my daughter Anne one feather bed of furniture and
 my riding horse & one or more saddles.

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Hall one feather bed of furniture
 & two Cows & calves.

Item I nominate and appoint John & his Robert Puller Execu-
 tors of this my last will & testament, And I do by these presents
 utterly disallow, revoke & annul all & every other
 wills & testaments, Legacies & bequests or executors by me before
 this time made, uttered or bequeathed & ratifying &
 confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 3^d
 day of the 10th month Called October 1766
