William Bark's Will

In the name of god amen, I William Bark of the County
of Northampton in the Province of North Carolina, being
at present very weak of body, but of perfect
sound mind & memory, thanks be to God, but caring to
mind the mortality of my body, do constitute and ordain
this my last will & testament in manner & form follow-
ing. (that is to say)

First I principally command my soul into the hands of al-
mighty god, hoping through the mysterious crop of
my blessed saviour to have full pardon of all my
sins & inherit everlasting life, and as for my body I
commit it to the ground from whence it was taken
to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the
discretion of my executors hereafter named, and arras-
sing all such temporal Estate as it hath pleased almighty
god to bestow upon me, I give & dispense of in maner
& form following.

I give & bequeath unto my son William Bark one hundred &
fifty acres of land situate two & a half miles & a two year old high-
way house & barn, I also give to my son Wm Bark
my negro girl named Hagar after his mother deceased, &
also give to my said son William Bark my featherbed furniture
I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Snipes my negro
woman named Phillis after her mother deceased,
I give the benefit of all the residue & remainder of my
Estate tenements goods & chattels unto my wife Mary
Bark during her natural life and after her decease
to be equally divided between my two children Mary
Snipes & William Bark, and I do constitute & appoint
my beloved friend Joseph Smith my whole sole executor
of this my last will & testament making due annealing
and marking severall other wills heretofore by me made
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this 23rd day of September 1761. North Park & seal

years of age. Likewise give to my beloved wife

all my hauⁿ hauⁿ goods & all my Stock.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Lewis Bagget my Slave - tation woman I now live. I like wise do leave my negro girl & all her increase to be divided between my children when the youngest is twenty years of age, But to my son Lewis Bagget I give no part of said Negro or negroes I do leave my wife Martha Bagget & my brother Abraham Bagget Executrix to this my last will, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this the twenty eighth day of December in the year of our Lord 1761.

Moses Hall's Will

Northampton County 3rd Decr known unto all men
North Carolina by these presents that I now
have being sick very weak of body but in perfect
strength of mind & memory do make & ordain this
my last will & testament that is to say, Principal
ly first of all I commend my soul into the hands
of God that gave it, my body I commit to the earth
to be decently buried at the discretion of my execu-
tors hereafter named & as touching such worldly
estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless
me with in this life I give & devise & dispose of
the same in the following manner & form,

first I will that all my just debts as I do owe in right or
Concerner to any person whatsoever be well & truly paid,
ordained to be paid in convenient time after my
death by my Executrix hereafter named.

Item I give to my dear wife the sole benefit of my plantation during her natural life or widowhood, and after her decease or marriage, I give said plantation to my son Moses Hall, I give to my son Moses Hall one Calf
Item I give to my wife one feather bed of moderate bigness belonging of four Cows & Calves, two large hewer bars one large Sides one Dozen of water plates half a dozen Earthen plates four large milk pans.

Item I give to my son Moses Hall one fair year old Steer one
three year old heifer, one broad Ax & one mow ax &c &c.

Item I give to my son Isaac Hall one feather bed of moderate bigness, long copper tools except iron drawing tools.

Item I give to my son Joseph Hall one feather bed of moderate bigness belonging one Cow & calf, two year old Steer & one broad heifer.

Item I give to my daughter Anne one feather bed of moderate bigness and
my riding horse & one woman saddle,

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Hall one feather bed of moderate bigness & two Cows & calves,

Item I nominate and appoint John & his Robert Miller executors of this my last will & testament and I do by these present
utterly disallow, revoke & annul all & every other
will & testament, legacies & bequests by me before
this time named made or bequeathed Ratifying &
Confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand on this 2^d
day of the 10th month called October 1762
