this the thirteenth day of August anno Domini
1777.

ton County in the province of Carolina being sick
of sound mind & memory do make Constitute appoint &
ordain this my last will & Testament in manner &
form following, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto
my son Jacob Bap one negro girl 21 mos 13 weeks &
her increase one feather bed & furnished & a mare colt
Colta pleasure, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto my
son Isaac Bap two negro women named Rose & Nell &
her increase one feather bed & furnished & a mare colt
Colta pleasure, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto my
grand son John Bap son of Isaac Bap a negro girl
named Fanny & her increase, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch
unto my son Abraham Bap one negro girl named
Phyllis & her increase, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto
my Grand Son Job Bap a negro girl named
Dun this in colour & one feather bed & furnished
Item I give Cevie Shiquatch unto my Grand Son Ceci-
el Bap son of Job Bap my land & plantation
whereon I now do live containing two hundred acres
more or less my negro fellow named Sharper my
old dog & all my negro boy named Seaton to
him his heirs & assigns forever, Item I give Cevie Shiquatch
unto my Grandson Uriah Bap son of Fanny my land &
plantation whereon the said Fanny now lives contain-
ing one hundred acres more or less joining Duckham's
Branch and Mrs Batts line also the half of my land
lying in Rurah Swamp joining Col. Dawson's line
also a negro woman named Hannah her increase
hereafter also a negro boy named Ben to him his
heirs & assigns forever Item I give Cevie Shiquatch
unto my daughter Alice Empson a negro woman

name of my menage also one negro boy named Pompey
Item I bind unto my daughter Vickie Connell the rest
of one negro woman named Deborah & her increase during
her life & at her decease I give & devise to my son
negro woman Deborah & her increase aforesaid to be equally
divided between or amongst her Children,

Item I give devise to my Grand Son Jeptha
Brattle son of John Brattle the Slave of Plantation
whereon the said John Brattle now containing two
hundred acres more or less bounded in an agreed
line already made also one hundred acres of land
adjoining my son Jethro's land an agreed line
already made and joining Charles Brattle's
also fifty acres of land I purchased of John
Kerry according to the most reasonable & reprobated
bounds thereof also one negro girl named Jane
and her increase to him his heirs & assigns forever

Item I give devise & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter
Margrata Brattle one negro boy named David,
Item I give unto my Grand Son John Brattle one negro
girl & her increase named Satt. How I give unto
my Grand Daughter Margrata 13,000 am negro
girl named Harriet & her increase Item I give
& devise to my Grandson Drury Brattle
two negro boy names Isham, Item I give unto
my Daughter Elizabeth Brattle one negro woman
named Judith her increase here after

Item I give devise to my son Jeptha Brattle all the remainder of my estate
that is not in my will given away to be equally divided
between or amongst my Children namely, Jacob
John, Abraham, Isaac, Jethro, & Drury Brattell &c.
each Andrew, Connell and Elizabeth Brattle & them
to them their heirs & assigns forever.

Item I do hereby ordain constitute & appoint my Esteemed
friend John Hunt my son John Brattell and Richard

Neal my whole estate executors of this my last
will & testament hereby disannulling & making null
& void all former wills & testaments by me hitherto
made & this only to be my last and valid testament, I do testify
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this four
teenth day of June One thousand seven hundred
ninety six.

John Boykin's Will

In the name of god Amen John Boykin of
N. Carolina in Northampton County being in perfect
sense & memory do and ordain this my last will &
testament in these manner as follows:

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Boykin the
plantation he now lies on the land I bought
of Thomas Brattell the land lying between the two
tracts of this side to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Barnell Boykin he
now lies on and all the lands belonging to it are a
sumary of land lying of the land that he lies on
and bounded on the bears Dens and Lickin on
plantation I bought of Charles Ganghell lying
in Gates Hole to him and his heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Boykin the
plantation I now lie on after the death of
