furniture the increase of the negro's lot to him his heirs &
spouse forever.

Item I bind to bear wife as long as she lies single.

Item I give to my wife two negroes namely Cate & Amy to her
heirs & spouse forever.

Item I give my daughter among three daughters namely Bethel Creag
Priscilla & their wives namely Temperance Cherry to be
Equally divided between them to them three daughters to them their
heirs & spouse forever.

Item Its my desire life & now I have call my household Goods to her
forever.

And I appoint my wife William Colcock whole sole Executrix
of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have
set my hand & first my seal this 3rd Day of April Anno 1781

my lawfully estate I dispose of the same in following manner.
It is my desire that all my just debts may be paid & settled after
my decease by my executors hereafter mentioned.
Item I give to my son Joseph Goodson the Plantation wheran he
lives. Item I give to my daughter Amy Marvel few shillings
Item I give to my daughter Cecilia Allen few shillings
Item I give to my son Edward Goodson the Plantation wheran
I now live to him & his heirs forever.
Item I give to my loving wife all my moveable Estate Real &
Personal to her heirs forever.
It is my desire that my wife should be quietly & peaceably possessed
with the Plantation & all my Estate wheran I now live forever
it not to be interrupted nor disturbed. I do nominate &
appoint my loving wife Judith Goodson my whole &
sole executrix. Ratifying & Confirming this to be my last
will testament in writing whereof I have set my hand &
affit my seal the day & year above written.

Sarah Gartling Will

In the name of God amen I Sarah Gartling of Northampton County
State of North Carolina being at present very sick & weak of body
but perfect ^{sound} mind & memory do make this my last will
desiring the mercifulies of my body to constitute & ordain this my
last will testament in manner following first I beseech
myself I commit my soul into the hands of God hoping to have a
just reward of all my sins through the sufferings of my blessed
Saviour & inhabit everlasting life as to my body I commit it to the
ground from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian

decent manner at the direction of my testators hereafter named
I relinquishing my temporal Estate as it hath pleased the Almighty
God to bestow upon me, I give and Dispose therof as followeth
first I declare that all my actual Debts be paid & discharged
Item I give & bequeath to Caesar M'Copeland all my land Plantation
whereon I now live, down head of Little, one horse & two hogs
one large pot & two iron Trunk one fowling piece & one pistol
Item I give & bequeath unto Samson Tadlock one acre of land
Item I give & bequeath to Cousin James Galland the son of Edward
Galland one Chest & Duff Box & one Barn one Cup plate & one
flat Plate,
Item I give & bequeath unto Cozen Ann Galland the Daughter of John
Galland one wash tub & one pair of Cotton Cards
Item I give & bequeath unto Cousin Sarah Galland the Daughter of
Edward Galland one Linen sheet.
Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Charity Britt one small bed
Stands & Head two blankets three Shutes
Item I give & bequeath to my Cousin Edward Galland the son of
John Galland five Shillings Specie
Item I give the residue & remainder of my Estate altho' & without
Doors to Cousin James Galland the son of Mr Galland & his
nominate & appoint Joseph Johnson & Elisha Pusey my
whole & sole Executors of this my last & sole Testament revoking
Disannulling & making void all other wills Heretofore made
by me in altho' whereof I have herunto set my hand & seal
the 2^d day of Sept 1782. Sarah Galland & her

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Williams one Negro man Sam & one
Negro Girl Phyllis & her increase for aforesaid Likewise I give my daughter
Williams five acres of Cattle
Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Polly Williams one negro
boy & one negro girl Lucy & her increase for aforesaid Likewise I give
to my daughter Polly Williams five acres of Cattle
Item I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Williams one negro James
& one negro Girl Gracia & her increase for aforesaid give to my
son Thomas Williams five acres of Cattle
Item I give & bequeath unto my son Brittain Williams one negro boy
Jerry & one by the name of aforesaid Likewise I give unto my son
Brittain Williams five acres of Cattle
Item I give & bequeath unto my son Wm Hart Williams two my rams
Jacob & Jim likewise I give to my son Wm Hart Williams five acres of Cattle
Item I leave to my beloved wife Martha Williams one negro woman called
Prop during of her life & after her decease the said Negro & her increase
to be equally divided between my four children Likewise I
likewise leave one negro woman named Anna & Solomon
during of her life or widowhood & after that to be equally
divided between my four Children Likewise I leave to my wife
one negro boy cuff during of her life or widowhood & after her
death or widowhood to be divided between my four Children
Likewise I give my wife Martha Williams a bed of furniture
said Stock Likewise my black horse & side saddle likewise give
my wife five acres of Cattle Likewise six acres of sheep
my wife to own & that my white horse Top & boy man & colt may
be kept for the use of my family.
Item I give & bequeath unto my four Sons John, Thomas, Brittain & William
Hart a plantation to be equally divided between the four boys but my will
& desire is that Elijah Hart may not be interrupted so long as she live
but may have a few privileges of my few lands on the River.
