In the name of God amen I Robert Boyd being sick & weak but of perfect mind & memory thankes be given unto God. Calling unto mind the mortallitie of my body & knowing that it is appurte for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament that is to say principally & first of all I commend my soul into the hand of almighty God that gave it & my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my friends hoping at thy greate & Glorie Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God. & to such intent where with it please God to let me live in this life I give & desire to dispose of in the following manner.

Item I give to Henry Jones one Shilling & eight pence per week money no more to be paid out of my Estate after my decease Item I give to my beloved wife Little Boyd all the rest of my estate vizt, Negroes, Stock of all kinds that I possess, Household goods & furniture to her own proper use & disposal forever & paying my just debts out of the above sume & Estate wherom I like wch I constitute make & ordain the late & executrix of this my last will & testament & I do hereby utterly & wholly revoke & disannul all & every other former Testament & wills by me before this & Executrix by me in any manner or way named wills & bequeathes Ratifying this the other to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have humbly set my hand & affixed my seal this thirtieth day of September in the year of our Lord Thos our thousand seven hundred & twenty three, signed & dated this day Robert ^{in his Hand} Boyd & seal

Samuel Pate's Will

In the name of God amen I Samuel Pate of Nanptown County Maryland being in perfect mind & memory (thanks be to God) do make & ordain this my last will & testament.

I command my soul to almighty God & my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named as to my dearest Estate I give & bequeath devise & dispose of in manner & form following.

Item I give unto my son Thomas Pate one hundred pounds Carolina Currancy.

Item I give unto my son Richard Pate one hundred pounds Carolina as Currancy & my Watch.

Item I give unto my son William Pate five Shillings Carolina Currancy & all my Apothecaryes Receipts Drugs & all my Physic Books & my clock.

Item I give unto my daughter Mary Pate three negroes & a boy from her to him & her heirs forever & my boy Henry Spearman & of Elisha Williams to be sold the money to be put out to interest upon business & ten pounds Virginia money now lying in the loan office in Williamsburgh to a new side saddle bridles to the value of eight pounds a hair money & two good Chairs & furniture.

Item I give unto my grand daughter Peggy Mykell one hundred pounds Carolina Currancy.

Item I give unto my Grand daughter Elizabeth Blant one hundred pounds Carolina Currancy.

Item I leave the negro Mary Pate during her widowhood no longer than six years, vizt, Slick ellings, Long & the plantation I lived upon & all my cattle Hogs sheep & three horses & all my furniture in the great House & kitchen as it now stands & all other necessary belonging to the plantation except the still I bought of Bryan Winborne which still Joseph Grant is to have the use of in first
