Francis Boykin's Will

In the name of God amen. I Francis Boykin of the County of Northampton in the Province of North Carolina being at present very sick & weak of body, but of perfect sound mind & memory thanks be to God, but calling to mind the mortality of my body do constitute & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following (that is to say) first & principally I Commit my soul unto the hands of God hoping to have full pardon of all my sins to inherit everlasting life, and as for my body I Commit it to the ground to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named; and as touching all such temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give & dispose thereof as followeth.

Item I give & bequeath unto my ^{only} daughter Mildred Wall one ~~Quarter~~ ^{Share} of the land.

Item I give unto my Grandson Samuel Boykin one Shilling & three Pence,

Item I give unto my Grandson Francis Boykin one Shilling & three Pence.
Item I give & bequeath all the residue of my Estate to my wife Sarah Boykin & my four Children.

(viz) Item I give to the Child my wife Grace is big with Child with, my plantation wherein I now live and one hundred acres of land I bought of my brother Sifer Stevenson all with the appurtenances of or belonging to both as well as all the land belonging to my said plantation to the said Child this or her heirs forever but of the said Child I have no issue it remains to lawfull age or married.
