thanketh to almighty God, of good sound disposing mind & mem-
ory & calling to mind the uncertainty of this transient life am will-
ing to make my last will in manner & form following that is
to say, first I give my soul to almighty God that gave it me
my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors
and as touching my worldly estate I give & bequeath
as follows, viz. Item I give to the Child my wife Grace
a log with Child with, my plantation wherein I now live
and one hundred acres of land I bought of my brother
John Stevenson with the appurtenances of or belonging to
both as well as all the land belonging to my said Plantation
to the said Child this or her heirs forever but of the said Child
thenceforth before it arrives to lawfull age or married
