

Thomas Brantley's Will

- Item In the Name of God amen I Thomas Brantley of North Carolina & Northampton County being sick but of perfect sense & memory to ordain this my last will & Testament in order & manner as followeth
- I give to my son James Brantley one negro boy & Cram to him and his heirs forever & Twenty pounds Current Money of Virginia to be given to him in the date 1780.
- Item I give to my son Ethelinda Brantley one Negro boy Cram to him and his heirs forever two Cows & calves one buck and furniture two dishes six plates & a basin one bay mare Bridle Saddle and twenty pounds Current Money of Virginia and one hagshree of Tobacco
- Item I give to Phanny Hart one Negro girl Amy and ten pounds Current Money of Virginia to her and her heirs forever & ten pounds to be paid herow the date 1780.
- Item I leave the estate of my plantation to my wife Martha Brantley during her widowhood or her natural life & after her decease I give my plantation to my sons Thomas Brantley & Sipe Brantley to be equally divided to them and theirs forever.
- Item I leave the goods of Dick, Harry, Sarah, Ann, Tony, Jeffry, Rachel, & Increase to my wife Martha Brantley & my Stock of every kind and house effects & every in Devise.
- Item I give all my Negroes my Harry, Dick, Sarah, Ann, Tony, Rachel, Jeffry, Increase & all their increase to be equally Devise among my wife Martha Brantley my daughter Mary Brantley Charlotte Brantley Lucy Brantley & Sipe Brantley and Sipe Brantley and the Child that she is with Child worth left the Negro

to her to raise Children with  
Item give Harry Dick, Sarah, Ann, Tony, Rachel, Jeffry, Increase & all their increase & my Stock & house Goods to be equally Devise among my wife Martha Brantley my Daughter Mary Brantley Charlotte Brantley Lucy Brantley & Sipe Brantley, Sipe and the Child that she is now with Child worth to be equally Devise when my Son Thomas Brantley comes to the age of twenty years to them and their heirs forever and I do appoint my wife Martha Brantley my sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament as witness my hand and seal this 10<sup>th</sup> day of February 1776.

William Pace's Will

- In the Name of God Amen May 14<sup>th</sup> 1772
- I William Pace of the County of Northampton in the province of North Carolina being in good health and of sound & disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will & Testament in manner following. Now I impriue I beseeche my soul to God that give it resting in his money thru the adversary and misfortune of our ever blessed Savior Christ for remission of all my offenses and my body to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors herein after appointed I and as such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I give and dispose thereof as follows (viz) I give & bequeath unto my living wife Maria & to her heirs & assigns my Negro Boy called Little Dick one negro boy & one negro girl
