William Bridger Will.

In the name of God Amen. The twenty third day of April in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & sixty three, I William Bridger of Northampton County in the province of North Carolina being sick in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory thank be to god & calling to mine that it is appointed for all men to die, do make & declare this my last will & testament hereby recommending my soul into the hands of my redeemer & my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors herein after named, And as touching my worldly estate wherewith it has pleased almighty God to bless me in this life I dispose of the same in the following manner (Wiz)
It is my will & desire that my beloved wife Rachel Bridger do have the use & benefit of my plantation & the lands thereunto belonging during her widowhood

- I give unto my daughter Elizabeth my plantation & land thereunto belonging & being three hundred & twenty acres, which her mother has the use of during her life or widowhood to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten of his body forever
- I give unto my son John Bridges one feather bed & furniture & my sword mare my own using gun & my saddle & bridle to him & his heirs forever
- I give unto my son John Bridges my plantation & land that I purchased of ~~John~~ ^{John} Caughtery also all my land that I purchased of Mrs Green Hill in of being woods & one feather bed & furniture & my young grey horse saddle & bridle & my gun that was Henry Caughterys & fifteen pounds Virginia Currency in the gold & silver coin, to him & his heirs forever
- I give unto my son Miles Bridges all ~~the~~ ^{that} land that I purchased of John Redick & one feather bed & furniture & my young dark bay mare & my gun that I purchased of fifteen pounds Virginia Currency, in the gold & silver coin to him & his heirs & assigns forever
- I give unto my daughter Elizabeth my negro girl named Linda & her increase, one feather bed & furniture & ten pounds Virginia Currency in gold & silver coin to her & her heirs & assigns forever
- I give my daughter Patience my negro girl named Hannah & her increase & one feather bed & furniture & ten pounds Virginia Currency in the gold & silver coin to her & her heirs & assigns forever
- I give unto my daughter Temperance my negro girl named Mandanary & one feather bed & furniture & ten pounds Virginia Currency in the gold & silver coin to her & her heirs & assigns forever
- It is my will & desire that all the legacies herebefore in my will given away to be made good out of my estate & that the residue I give unto my wife & my beloved wife Rachel Bridges for her to maintain and

have my children schooled, that is my three sons William John & Mills each to be taught to read all sorts of Cyphers as far as the rule of practice perfect & my Daughters to read & write to her etc her & her heirs & assigns forever

Item I do hereby nominate & ordain constitute & appoint my beloved wife Rachel Bridgers Mrs Ruffin & John Duke & Richd Peate Executors of this my last will & testament hereby disannulling & making null & void all former wills & testaments by me made, & this only to be my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fixed my seal this day & date herein before written. In the name of God Amen, I Charles Cotton of the province of North Carolina & County of Northampton being in a weak & feeble state of health but thankful to God of good sound disposing mind & memory, Calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life am willing to make this my last will & testament in following manner & form, that is first I give my soul to almighty God that gave it me Humbly beseeching him to take me into his fatherly hands & to assist me in the right way that leads to life & glory, knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, & my body to be buried at the

- discretion of my Executors hereafter named, & my funeral expenses discharged, I do give & bequeath as follows
- Item I give the sum of 100 pounds unto my brother William Cotton one negro man called Trax that he increase to him & his heirs forever.
- also I give to my brother William Cotton one bay horse called Nap & my saddle & bridle to him forever
- Item I give the sum of 100 pounds unto my brother Robert Cotton my plantation & land thereunto belonging to him & his heirs forever, also I give to my brother Robert Cotton one grey horse called Gray to him forever.
- Item It is likewise my will & desire that all my other estate both goods & chattels shall be equally divided between my above mentioned brothers Wm Cotton & Robert Cotton.

I do nominate & appoint my wife beloved brother Robert Cotton my whole sole & executor of this my last will & testament revoking & disannulling all former wills by me made as I do drop my hand & seal this 10th day May 1763.
