

William Parworthys Will

In the name of God Amen I William Parworthys of Beaufort  
County in the Province of Carolinae, being sick & weak but in  
perfect sense of memory thanks be to almighty God do make  
and ordain this my last will in manner following to wit  
I give & bequeath my soul to god that gave it & my body to the  
earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter  
named, I give & bequeath to my daughter Peggy Parworthys  
all my lands whereon I now live to her & her heirs for ever  
with all the rest of my estate of what nature or kind soever  
to her & her heirs forever, And lastly I appoint my daughter  
Peggy Parworthys my whole sole executrix of this my  
last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunder  
set my hand & affixed my seal this 29<sup>th</sup> day of Jan 1779.  
In the presence of us Wm Parworthys & usual  
Kinsfolk Flavers, John et George, Justitiehle

Northampton County 1st June County 1780.

John Brittle's Will

In the name of God Amen I John Brittle of the County of Roanoke in State of No Carolinae, being in perfect health &  
sound memory thanks be to god for it knowing it apper  
unto me for all mortalitie to make & ordain this my last will  
testament as follows.

I give & bequeath unto my son Jeph Brittle his heirs forever  
thre hundred acres of land together with the plantation where  
on I now live, also two acre of grass, Jeffrey & Hannahs first heir  
of Castle & two feather beds & furniture in case my son Jeph  
die without lawful issue, my executors desire is that they may  
say fail to my son Britain Brittle this heirs forever.  
Item I give & bequeath unto my son Britain Brittle this heirs

hundred two hundred & thirty acres of land joining  
the land & plantation given to my son Jeph Brittle, with  
orchard lying on the River on tract of land above two  
acres thick & full two feather beds & furniture & five head  
of cattle In case my son Britain die without lawful issue  
my executors desire is that the legacy fail to my son Jesse Brittle  
& his heirs forever.

Item I leave the use of one hundred acres of land to the same more  
or less bounded as follows, to wit, begining at Howell Edmon  
nd corner on Dick's Branch thence along sd Branch and so  
to a corner of Big Branch, thence along Branch line to a pine  
standing in the Trap Pond thence along a line of marked  
trees to a pine standing in the Buzzard Branch thence down  
the sd Branch to Dick's Branch & down the same to the first  
station to my son Big Brittle & wife during life & after death  
of their said issue I give the said land to my grandson How  
ling Brittle this heirs forever in case my grandson How  
ling die without lawful issue my executors desire is that  
the said land fail to my grandson Phillips Brittle this heirs forever.  
Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter little Barbara one hundred  
bushels of corn & wheat & side saddle & two one bed of pasture  
to her heirs forever. And in case my daughter little Bar  
bara die without issue my executors desire is that the  
same fail to my son Jeph Brittle forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Brittle his heirs forever  
one hundred pounds current money of Virginia

Item I give & bequeath unto Sarah Brown one hundred pounds current  
money of Virginia & feather Bed & furniture also one horse  
& side saddle to her heirs forever.

Item my executors desire is that after all my just debts are paid that all  
the remainder part of my Estate of all kinds whatsoever be  
equally divided between my son Jeph Brittle & Britton Brittle  
constituets & appoint my sons Jeph Brittle & Britton my whole  
executors of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof

Lewis Williamson Will

In the name of God amen I Lewis Williamson of the County of N.  
in the State of North Carolina being weak now but of sound &  
disposing mind, do make this my last will & testament in man  
of form following.

I give unto my living wife Priscilla Williamson during her  
life six negroes to wit, Woodley Hancock Sam Lucy Parrot  
Jubal who also I give unto my loving wife a tract or parcel of  
Land during her widowhood beginning at the little Path  
by Hogwards then a long the Sd path to a white oak in a pond  
then to the head of a branch which was the dividing line  
between David Hyde & his Williamson then down the said branch  
thru hundred yards to the South of Middle Spring Branch then down  
the Spring Branch to the Hie Creek then down the Sd Creek to the  
big tree along his line to his corner then along James Williamson  
line to Hie Creek then along Hie Creek to the Road  
then down the Sd Road to the first Station

Item I give thengrath unto my son Benjamin McLean Williamson all  
my land on both sides of Pott's Creek Containing by Esti-  
mation two thousand eight hundred acres by the same more  
or less, also the following negroes to wit, Anthony White, Arthur  
Molato, Jack Sider, Davy, Toney, Jubb, Henry, Slavy, the  
wives Fanny, Isom, Luce, Isaac, Abigail, Fannie  
Daughters of Paul Brown, also half of the slave King  
Harris our boy born right full, also one half of the Hockhorns

Black Castle, Shipe Hogs, three feather beds & furniture or  
any other part of my household furniture or any other Plan-  
tation utensils that my beloved wife thinks she can best spare  
also a tract of Land in Warren County adjoining Frances  
Rounton also a parcel of land in Halifax County known by  
Tucker Harris Sailor & Perrys containing four hundred  
Acres more or less before this Wills signature forever but  
it is my will & given that my son should not receive his  
Estate until he comes to the age of twenty one years or more

Item I give unto my Daughter Priscilla Williamson all my Lands  
below the Roanoke River from William Eaton's Ferry  
to Hinsford also Simmagrass tract, Hall's Creek Millsey  
Island, also Charlott to her heirs forever also one half  
their bed of furniture.

Item I give to my Daughter Rebecca Williamson a tract or  
parcel of land beginning on the River where Gilliam's line  
crosses the Rd Road then along the Road to Eaton's line then  
by Eaton's line King Hyde Johnson's Gilliam's to the first  
Station also six negroes to wit, Bush, French, Melby, Sally  
Jim Robin also one feather bed & furniture to her heirs  
forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Williamson a tract or  
parcel of land lying in Halifax County on both sides  
of Great Creek beginning at Jackson's line where the mill  
path Congress it runs east to the law grounds up the law  
Grounds to the lower part of the Creek that the mill stands  
on then a straight line to the mouth of a branch  
that Henry Dawson laid out then up the branch to Kure  
cherry Ferry on the Road, then down the road to the  
fork then along Marshall & Miller's line to Great Creek  
then up the said creek to Alston & Jackson line to the  
first station also seven negroes to wit, Billy, Sally  
Staney, Abram, Ephraim, Portroyal, old Pittie also  
one feather bed of furniture to her heirs forever

Item I give unto my Daughter Martha Weston a tract or
