William Andrew Will

In the Name of God amen. I William Andrew of North-
ampton County, being very sick & weak in body but of a
perfect mind & memory thank be unto God for the same.
Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life & knowing
it is appointed for all men once to die, I make & ordain this
my last Will & Testament, revoking & disannulling all other
Will or wills heretofore made by me. And first of all I give
my soul to God that gave it me relying on the merits of my
beloved Saviour to have full Pardon for all my sins & as for my
worldly Goods as God hath blessed me with I give & dispose
as followeth to wit.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Gray Andrews, three negroes
Called Edy, Ale & Steele & one Dog Chain.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Abraham Andrews, three ne-
groes, Called Hannah, Bill & Sam & two iron Bridges &
my Carpenter Tools.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Abraham Andrews, my Land &
Plantation & eight Cattle six Sheep.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Andrews four negroes
Called, Gato, Allen, Sue & Sam; one feather bed of a mixture

Eight pounds Proo, Six Shgs & Carpenter Tools.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Gran Andrews four negroes Cal-
led Bill, Tom, Amy & Edy, one feather bed & furniture eight
pounds Proo, Six Shgs.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Gran Andrews my Turners tools
which makes do to my little Gun.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Averilla Andrews, to her &
her Heirs lawfully begotten of her body four negroes Cal-
led Phyllis, Maria, Cherry & Lewis, one feather bed & furniture.

Item I give to my beloved wife Martha Andrews one negro Cal-
led Abigail & four head of cattle.

Item I lend the labour of four negroes, called our Phyllis Sally &
Cate, the use of one feather bed of furniture during her widow-
hood.

Item I leave my ready money after the payment of my just
Debts to be equally divided between Gray Andrews, Abraham
and said William Andrews, Gran Andrews & her said
daughter.

Item The remaining part of my Estate which I have not given
away to be equally divided between William Andrews
Gran Andrews, and Averilla Andrews, after my wife
widowhood, I do appoint Gray Andrews, Abraham
Andrews & William Andrews my whole Estate Exec. of this
my last will & Testament, Feby 25th 1778.

of a great age, but of perfect memory I thank be God for the same, knowing the mortallity of my body & that all men are appointed to die, and I do make & ordain this Writing to contain my last Will & Testament. First of principally I command my soul into the merciful hands of God my Creator hoping thru the meritorious death & Resurection of my Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive Pardon for my sins. my body I commit to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian manner at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and as for my worldly Estate wherewith God hath blessed me in this life, I dispose of the same in manner & form following.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife beloved friend Elizabeth Ellis one small tract or parcel of land bounded between David Woods Robert Ellis & John Manders Line and all the rest to my estate whether Goods Chattels or ready money to her the best of my power.

Lastly I constitute ordain & appoint my wife beloved friend Elizabeth Ellis my sole Exec. of this my last Will & Testament Recording & making vs'd all other or former wills by me hitherto made. Joseph Vining Will

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Vining of Northampton County in Province of North Carolina being sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thank be given unto God calling unto mind the mortallity of my body and knowing that it is apparent to all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament, that is to say principally first of all I give & command my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and

my body I command to be earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my executors. Nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, & continuing such worldly Estate where with I hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the same in the following manner & form First of all my will & desire is that my debts are to be paid by executors my just debts paid out of them.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son James like my Plantation tract of Land I bought of William Dawson to him this his forever also give him my said son James my negro boy named Tom & one negro girl named Hannah to him & his heirs forever. Likewise give him eight head of Cattle & six breeding Sows, six head of Sheep and one grey horse. Cattle & Sows I leave to him also I thought of Atherton & the said Stock & Negroes is to be kept on the Plantation till my said son James comes of the age of twenty one years in order for him to receive. Also give him my Gun that I bought of Samuel Edwards

Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas like my Plantation tract of Land I bought of Saml. Davis the Plantation tract of Land I bought of John Gay to him this his forever also I give to my said son Thomas one negro boy Ben & one negro girl Phillis the Children of Saml. to him this his forever. But my beloved wife is to have the Labour of the Girl Phillis during the time she lies a widow or till my said son Thomas comes of the age of twenty one years. I also give him my said son Thomas the Cattle now on the Plantation in possession of John Ingram six head of Sheep & four breeding Sows, & the said stock is to be kept on the Plantation till my said son comes of age twenty one years in order for him to receive them and I also give him one of the saddles that Joseph Vining is to make & my great Gun.

Item I give & bequeath to my son William like my plantation where I now live in tract of land I bought of Robert Williams & the remainder of my land joining Samuel Edwards & his aches, Thomas sister up the Creek to the little swamp to him this his forever but
