

Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Thomas the Plantation shewd he now lives in Northampton County on the South side of White Cat Swamp to him & his heirs or assigns forever. I also give to my Son Thomas our Negro David for nine years of which time the said Negro to be equally divided between my Sons Francis & Solomon hereof mentioned to them & their heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my Son Michael one Tract of Land by estimation Six Hundred & fifty Acres in Northampton County lying on the said branch to him his heirs or assigns forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my Son Francis all the land known on the South side of the Cappo Swamp which I purchased of William Hill to him his heirs or assigns forever. I also give my Son Francis one negro girl Susannah & her increase to him & his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give the plantation to my Son Solomon our Planter lying in Northampton County on the South side of Broaday Roaco, which I purchased of John Long Cotton to him & his heirs or assigns forever. I also give to my Son John one our negro Girl hat other Increase, to him his heirs or assigns forever.

Item. I give all my Negroes not heretofore mentioned with all my other Estates whatsoever, after my just debts be paid off, to my wife Jane Blunt, to be equally divided among my following Children, William Michael, Francis, Charlotte & Solomon, when my son Francis shall come to the age of twenty One years, to be equally dividing in Quantity & Quality according to the Judgment of Francis Brantley, John Blunt & William Blunt, to them & their heirs or assigns forever. And to appoint my Sons William Thomas & Michael whole sole & sole of this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 31st day of March A.D. Dom 1770.

William Bryan & Hill

In the name of God amn. I William Bryan of Northampton County Province of North Carolina, being at present very sick & weak in body, but in sound mind & memory, make this my last will & Testament. Calling to mind the mortality of my Body, & Considering this my last will & Testament in manner & form following that is to say first & principally I Commit my soul into the hands of almighty God, hoping to have full pardon for all my sins, & to inherit everlasting life, as for my body I Commit it to the ground from whence it was taken to be buried in a Christian like decent manner, at the discretion of my wife hereafter named, as touching all such temporal Estate as it hath, please Almighty God to bestow upon me, I give & dispose thereof as followeth.

First of all I would that all my real debts & funeral Charge be paid & discharged,

Item. I give the use of the plantation at heron Hill with two hundred & thirty acres of land to my living wife Jane Bryan during her natural life, & after her decease I give the same to my beloved son William Bryan his heirs.

Item. I give the plantation to my daughter Barbara Mabry her plantation when she marries with forty acres of land, to her heirs. All the rest of my Estate Goods & Chattels within doors & without I give to be equally dividing between my wife & my son William & my two Daughters Martha & Abigail, and I Constituted appaint my Brother Bryan & my living wife Jane Bryan my whole estate & all the rest of this my last will & Testament so long as I am alive & making use of all other abilities before made by me

Henry Dawson's Will

In the name of God Amen I Henry Dawson
of Northampton County ⁱⁿ Province of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory, thanks be to God, but calling to mind the mortality of mankind & knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, make & ordain Constitute & Appoint this my last will & testament, in manner & form following to wit:

I give to my son John Dawson, his heirs & assigns forever my Plantation & all the lands thereunto belonging, which I bought of Thomas Hart in the County of Edgecomb or Somers Swamp & in case my said son John die before he arrives to lawfull age or marriage, then I give the said land & plantation to my son Stephen Dawson, his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give to my son Henry Dawson his heirs & assigns the following tracts of land lying in the County of Northampton to wit, one hundred acres being the plantation whereon I now live, also one hundred acres of land which I bought of William Cotton & Eliza his wife, in said County also two tracts joining each other on Roanoke River, in the law ground containing about three hundred & twenty acres each tract: & also three hundred acres in said County being the plantation which I bought of John Wilson in said County. & in case my said son Henry Dawson die before he arrives to lawfull age or marriage, then I give all the lands mentioned to him to say son Stephen except those hundred acres bought of John Wilson.

Item I give herewith unto my son Stephen Dawson his heirs & assigns forever, the following tracts of land in the County of Edgecomb to wit, two tracts of land on Tar Creek containing about six hundred acres, also one tract lying in Conants Precinct, containing about three hundred acres.

Item I give herewith to my living wife Eleazar Dawson her heirs & assigns, one negro woman named Frank.

Item I give herewith the remainder of my whole estate consisting of every kind whatsoever, that is not herein before mentioned or given in legacies, to be equally divided between my wife Eleazar my three sons herein before & my two daughters Mary Dawson & Patty Dawson & their heirs & assigns. I have made & share make & share make Lastly I nominate Constitution & appoint my living wife Eleazar & my trustee Friend Dr. Peter Hobson Kinchen &c. to execute this my last will & testament hereby revoking & disannulling all other Wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 5th day of May 1770 signed sealed & declared by... *Henry Dawson & seal*

& it is known to all men by these presents that whereas I Henry Dawson of the County of Northampton & Province of North Carolina have made & declared my last will & testament in writing, bearing date 5th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred forty four. I the said Henry Dawson do by this my last will & testament confirm & ratify my last will & testament & do give herewith unto my son Stephen Dawson, all that my service or tract of land I bought of John Hardell, situate lying being in the County of Edgecomb with the appurtenances, to have & to hold to him his heirs forever, also all my stock of cattle & hogs on the said premises, to have & to hold them his heirs forever, and my will & meaning is that the Codicil or Schedule be & held & judged part & parcel of my said last will & testament.
