### Thomas Pace's will

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Pace of the County of Northampton  
being in body but of sound mind & memory. I give be go &  
do this fourth Day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
forty four. Make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner following.  
that is to say,

Imprimis I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Amy two negroes Bob & Jude  
also one feather bed & furniture and one small Mar. named Diamond also  
four Pots. Dishes two Pots. Barns. Six Pots. Plates. Also the use  
and of my Mar. Plantation wherow I now lie during her life  
here & if she dies, Mary then I give her the use of my Plantation  
land & tenents belonging on the Hill in lieu of her Dower.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter, Eliza the Negro girl named Bi-  
nah fifty Pounds Virginia Money.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel this land is forever. My  
Plantation & land & tenents belonging known by the name of my  
old Plantation & then I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel & Sarah.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Joannas two negroes, Joe & Mase,  
Item I give & bequeath & leave to my son Thomas the Plantation wherow  
I now lie & the land & tenents belonging plus negroes. Eliza & Peter.  
Stay to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter along one Negro girl named.

One fifty Pounds Virginia Money.

Item I give & bequeath & leave to my son Richard this land forever my first  
Mile of Plantation on Cedar Creek & all the land thereunto belonging &  
also two Negroes & Cedar.

Item all the rest & residue of my goods chattels, personal estate & all money  
be applied to the payment of my debts, and after debts paid if there shall be  
any surplus, I desire that the same may be divided equally among my chil-  
dren & my wife & certain my son Nathan Hale deceler of this my friend late

Bethel an overseer or manager to a part of my said deceler during his life  
performed. Till the death of the said Thomas Pace & in case to this my  
last will & Testament set my hand seal the Day & year above written  
Signed, sealed & published by the said Thomas Pace & seal

Thomas Pace aforesaid his last will & Testament in the presence of us who bear  
witness our names are signed in the testator present at his request  
William Pace & Nathaniel Pace his son.

### William Buffalow Will

In the Name of God Amen. I William Buffalow of Northampton County  
being weak & sick of body but of good perfect & memory desirous  
to amend his last will & Testament.

First & principally I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God, hoping  
thru the merits Death & Resurrection of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have fra-  
pation of all my sins. & my body I command to the ground to be buried  
decently by my executors hereafter named.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Matthew Buffalow all the upper part of my  
land on which is a Mill Swamp beginning at a turkey oak & running  
up the said Swamp to a branch then up the said branch to a tree  
line, then along this same line to a corner tree in one side from thence a  
straight course to the beginning to run my son Matthew Buffalow his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Buffalaw his Plantation now  
liver on & all the remainder of my land excepted fifty acres joining Scipio  
etums line which fifty acres I give to my Brother Arthur Buffalaw  
In Herling Buffalaw, to him my son William & my Brother Arthur's  
son Harry their heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son William Buffalaw one feather bed furniture  
to him my son William Buffalaw his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Matthew Buffalaw my feather bed furniture  
to him my son Matthew Buffalaw his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Ruth six pound gold & silver coin

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Lucy Buffalaw six pound gold  
& silver coin. To be paid to them at twenty years of age or on the day of  
marriage & to be that my Daughter Ruth or Lucy shall die  
before they marry or come to twenty years of age my will is that  
the survivor of them shall have the other legacy which I give to them  
here heirs forever.

Item My will is that the negro man Lang the iron master shall labor for the  
support of my before named Children, till my children, in case of  
diseaseth that then the Negro Lang the iron master shall pay back of all kinds  
of all my household goods excepting the lot of feather bed & furniture  
I have already given away to equally divided among my other  
Children, to them their heirs & assigns forever.

And Lastly I appoint my son Matthew Buffalaw & my friend John Webb Jr &  
my whole sole executors to this my last will & testament making & remanding  
making back all <sup>the</sup> ~~all~~ <sup>the</sup> will he before made by me in witness  
whereof I have put my hand & signed my seal this 21 day January 1765

Northampton County, the <sup>22<sup>nd</sup></sup> Feby 1765

Samuel Perkins. I Will

In the name of God, the tenth day of December, in the year of our Lord  
Christ one thousand seven hundred and forty four Samuel Perkins  
of Northampton County in North Carolina being sick of death in  
body, but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be to almighty God  
& calling to remembrance the uncertain state of this transitory life  
& that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please god to  
call, do make & ordain & declare this to be my last will & testament  
in further settling of my temporal estate, all debts & dues as I owe  
to be paid within convenient time after my decease by my executors  
hereafter, I give & despatch in manner following:

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Perkins two head of young  
Cattle & also a <sup>new</sup> iron Pot, one Dozen Pates Bacon two plates, one dish  
one Linen cloth to her the heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Perkins two head of  
young Cattle & one Iron Pot, one Dozen Pates Bacon two plates, one dish  
one Linen cloth to her the heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Jeremiah Perkins two head of young  
Cattle & one Iron Pot, one Dozen Pates Bacon two plates, one dish & one gun to him this  
heir present & also one hundred & twenty six acres of land, to be sold,  
beginning at the Poplar branch, one acre to be sold to him.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife Belinda wife Mary Perkins one mare &  
one Cow living with Calf & all the Hogs belonging to the Plantation  
all the Corn & Peas, two Sifters & all the rest of my Pewter & two sets  
her bed furniture, two Chests, one Table a Can of Knives, & a Shear  
& Chair and tray all my Books, only a prayer book & Bible & Testaments  
I give unto my son in law John Purvis, and also I give unto my wife  
one doleful cloth, two pair of Cards one box & theater a powdered  
Spur Cedar barrels one arbor & Pough all by her to my son  
Jeremiah Perkins my Master Plantation whereon I now live to take  
it at the age of twenty one & of this my last will & testament which  
I make, ordain & appoint my well beloved Mary Perkins Dugart  
(daughter Robert Pulling) my whole executors recording & annealing  
all other forms or Wills by me made, Confirming this & none other
