 of Northhamblen County & State of North Carolina  
 being at present sick & weak of body but in  
 perfect health sound mind & memory thanks  
 to god therefore calling to mind the frailty  
 of my Body to make & ordain this my last

Will & Testament that is to say first I wille  
 that all my actual debts be paid and discharge

Item

I give to my son Rhodes Washley four hundred  
 and thirty acres of Land lying up Swamps  
 Swamps beginning at the mouth of the middle  
 branch then up the branch through the head to  
 the side Cab then down the side Cab to the  
 patent line then a long the side line to a corner  
 black Jack then up Swamps Road to Swamps  
 Swamps then down the Swamps to Benjamin  
 Tanners line then a long his line to a corner  
 then still a long line marked down to the great  
 branch then down the branch to the Swamps  
 Swamps then down the Swamps to the beginning  
 also one man one feather bed & furniture to  
 him and his heirs forever

Item

I give to my son Samuel Washley three hundred  
 acres of Land and plantation whereon I now live  
 after my wife deceas also the one half of my  
 Will I give to my son Rhodes Washley also I give  
 to my son Samuel Washley one fifty and one feather  
 bed & furniture

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Washley one feather  
 bed & furniture

Item

I give to my daughter Mary Washley one feather  
 bed and furniture

I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Washley

Item

I give to my son James Washley one feather  
 bed & Furniture All the remainder my estate  
 within Dons & Withoul I give to my said  
 wife during her life and at her death I give the  
 same to be equally divided among all my  
 children my desire is that my son Rhodes Washley  
 & Samuel Washley should <sup>maintain</sup> ~~support~~ my son James  
 Washley I do constitute and appoint my son Rhodes  
 Washley my sole & sole executor of this my last  
 Will & Testament. Revoking making void all  
 other Wills heretofore made by me in Wills  
 whereof I have heretofore set my hand and seal  
 this 21st March 1784
