William Bark's Will

In the name of god amen, I William Bark of the County
of Northampton in the Province of North Carolina, being
at present very weak of body, but of perfect
sound mind & memory, thanks be to God, but caring to
mind the mortality of my body, do constitute and ordain
this my last will & testament in manner & form follow-
ing. (that is to say)

First I principally command my soul into the hands of al-
mighty god, hoping through the mysterious crop of
my blessed saviour to have full pardon of all my
sins & inherit everlasting life, and as for my body I
commit it to the ground from whence it was taken
to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the
discretion of my executors hereafter named, and arras-
sing all such temporal Estate as it hath pleased almighty
god to bestow upon me, I give & dispense of in maner
& form following.

I give & bequeath unto my son William Bark one hundred &
fifty acres of land situate two & a half miles & a two year old high-
way house & barn, I also give to my son Wm Bark
my negro girl named Hagar after his mother deceased, &
also give to my said son William Bark my featherbed furniture
I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Snipes my negro
woman named Phillis after her mother deceased,
I give the benefit of all the residue & remainder of my
Estate tenements goods & chattels unto my wife Mary
Bark during her natural life and after her decease
to be equally divided between my two children Mary
Snipes & William Bark, and I do constitute & appoint
my beloved friend Joseph Smith my whole sole executor
of this my last will & testament making due annealing
and marking severall other wills heretofore by me made
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this 23rd day of September 1761. North Park & seal
