

Item I give hereunto unto my son William Hagland, two Negroes vizt. Hannibal Peter which I bought of Josias Crumps, also one feather bed & furniture, also my best coat all which I give to my aforesaid William Hagland this heirs forever.

Item I give hereunto my son Stephen Hagland, one Negro fellow named Hardy, to him this heirs forever. I further give to my said son Stephen Hagland, ten pound Proclamation Money.

Item I give hereunto to my son Thomas Hagland one Negro boy named Solomon & ten pound Pro. Money, to him this heirs forever.

Item my will & desire is that all my lands and other Estate of what kind or nature so ever, which I have not already given away, shall be sold at the discretion of my execs, & the money arising from the same & the money that is due to be equally divided between my three sons William Hagland Stephen Hagland & Thomas Hagland, after my just & legal funeral charges are discharged.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my brother William Hagland & John Nail my execs, of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 13th day of March 1771. George Hagland & seal signed sealed & attested as his last will & testament in presence of John Richard, Thos Barrett, Thos Short.

In the name of God amen, John Turner of Northampton County in the Province of North Carolina, Planter being Sick & weak, but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be to almighty God for the same, & calling to mind that it is ^{expressed} appointed for all men to die.

and having a minute & dispose of my Estate which it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with I give & dispose of the same in manner ~~of~~ ^{perfect}

First I give my soul to almighty God that gave it me & my body to be buried in such Christian Burial as my execs shall think fit and then all my just debts to be paid, and then to dispose of the Rest as in manner aforesaid.

Item First I give to my Daughter Nancy Sheffield five Shillings Proclamation money. I leave the use of my Land & Plantation with all the rest of my Estate to my wife Mary during her natural life, and then I give hereunto the same Land & Plantation with all other part of my Estate to my Daughter & Successors to her & her heirs. I leave my Daughter Susan & William Mabry Execs to this my last will & testament made this 7th day of Decr 1770.

Isaac Campbells Will

In the name of God amen, I Isaac Campbell, being at present sick & weak of Body, but of ^{perfect} sound mind & memory, thanks be to God there fore, calling to mind the mortality of my Body, do constitute and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following that is to say, first & principally I commit my soul into the hands of God, hoping to have full & free Pardon of all my sins & to inherit everlasting life, as for my body I commit it to the ground from whence it was taken, to be buried in such Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my execs here after mentioned, & as touching all such temporal Estate as it has pleased God to bestow upon me, I give & dispose thereof as follows, first I would that all my debts be paid & discharged.

Item I give hereunto unto my beloved son William Campbell certain tract of land beginning at a red Oak standing in

the ridge Passover, then by a line of marked trees to the boiling Springs or Cutlawby Swamp, then along a line of marked trees to a white oak standing in the head line by the side of a pond, then along the head line to the corner in the Huckleberry pond, then the patent land to the first station.

Item I give the my dear wife my beloved son James Campbell the plantation wherein I now live, he begins at the beginning of the patent then running that line to the Red Oak in the ridge Passover then a line of marked trees to the boiling Springs in the said Swamp, then the various Courses of the state to the first Station.

Item I give the my dear wife my Daughter Eusebia Campbell a parcel of land beginning at the boiling Springs then that line of marked trees of James Campbell to the head line to a white oak, then along the head line to the next corner, then along the last of the patent to a corner tree in the said Swamp, then the various Courses of the state to the first Station, I also give unto my Daughter Eusebia one side saddle to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give the my dear wife my beloved Mariam Campbell my negro slave named Venus, also my negro boy named Lemur, to her & her heirs forever, but in Case she die with out him & him, I give the same two negroes to be equally divided between my two sons William Campbell & James Campbell & my Daughter Eusebia Campbell, I also give to my Daughter Mariam Campbell her horse & her mare.

Item I give to my grand daughter Jacob Daughters five shillings more & all the residue & Remainder of my Estate Good & Chattels within & without Doors, I give to be equally divided between my four Children, William James Eusebia & Mariam, & I do constitute & appoint my two sons William Campbell & James Campbell my whole sole Executors of this my last will & testament, revoking, annulling & making void all other wills heretofore made by me, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 15th day of April 1771.

William Skinner Will.

In the name of God amen. the 19th day of Aug. 1771. I William Skinner of the Province of North Carolina and County of Northampton, being very sick & weak in body but in perfect mind & memory thanks be to God, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my Body, & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & Testament that is to say, Principally of first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hand of God that gave it, & my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty Power of God, & as touching such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life, I give & devise & dispose of the same in the following manner & form.

Item I leave to Susannah my dear & beloved wife half the Plantation excepting half the Orchard, during her life & widowhood, likewise one half of a place called the Indian Branch Land lying in Northampton County in the Province of Carolina, I leave to her during her life & widowhood, likewise I lend her the use of the negro called Peter, Rose & Venus during her life & widowhood, but if she marry my dear & dear wife that my beloved son William Skinner should have all the above mentioned to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give the my dear wife my dear & beloved son, more called Poll to her & her heirs & assigns forever. Likewise I give to her three Cows & calves during her life & one young Heifer two young stags three Ewes & Lambs, eight two year old Hogs, two year old Boars, two sows & twelve pigs, one half of the gear, during her natural life, & I lend her two feather bed during her natural life, & half the bedding four stoves, one Chest one Case of bottles one half of the Glass & stoves ware, two sideboards
