Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Vinton one hundred acres of land lying
to the north side of Bear Swamp to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son James Vinton of Plantation wherun I now
dwell containing one hundred of fifty acres of land lying between Snake
Swamp & Bear Swamp to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Susanah Morgan five ^{pieces} ~~shillings~~ Virginia
Currency to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son David Vinton five shillings
Virginia Currency to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Peter Vinton six pounds Virginia Currency
to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Gutter five pounds Virginia
Currency to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Isabell Dashiell five pounds Virginia
Currency to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Charity Carter fifty acres
of land lying on the south side of Bear Swamp to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife beloved wife Dorothy Vinton
all the rest of my estate my negroes & my riding horses & cattle
& the rest of my temporal estate & goods & I give her the use of them during her natural life.

and after her decease to be valued & the value equally divided
between all the aforementioned Children, and of this my last
will & Testament I make nominate & appoint to my trusty &
well belov'd friends my nearest kinsmen, & James Carter
my sole Executor, reciting & naming all other ^{trusties} ~~friends~~
by me heretofore made, ratifying & confirming this & no other
to be my last will & testament, the witness whereof I have set
my hand seal.

cows three young cattle one large iron pot & then pecter, basin & salt
pug & wash bowls, one bed & the furniture belonging to it & all the
rest of my household stuff & also my side board, to the said Katharine
forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my weblet son Jane Carter my cow
& all my hogs & all my past & land.

William Short Will

In the name of god almighty I William Short of the Parish of Saint George in the County of Northampton County
the vicine of Northampton, being very sick & weak in body
but of sound mind & memory & understanding think it to be almighty
by God for the same, knowing the certainty of death other con-
tinue of life, having so much regard to my last will
testament in manner of my following so act, first &
principally I recommend my soul to almighty God that
giveth my body to the earth like buried at the execu-
tion of my executors here after mentioned.

I promise & give by my mark unto my son John Short all the land my daughter
purchased of Wm Chamber except about two acres in the summer
or less and is marked off joining the previous line, other river
which runs back of land, I give to my son John Short his heirs
forever, all the upland called Branks Island & the uppart
of the low land called Millers Island, which I purchased
of Jas. a Taylor, including the ridge land & observing that the
before mentioned part of millers Island includes all the
lands above a gut running through it which said Island

I give to my son John Short his heirs forever or one hundred
acres to land be the same more or less, if further given to
my son John short two negro boys old will be given to him &
his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Short four hundred acres
of land be the same more or less viz Beginning at the head of
my marsh pond or otherwise at the mouth of Daceon Branch
then ~~going~~ a south east course along a line of marshy trees
& up a small branch to the head thereof from thence along a
line of marshy trees to the center of three oaks near my gate
marked for corner trees of from thence a line of marshy trees
right an east course to the road that crosses the upper ridge
in the ocean side swamp, then down the said road to the outer
edge of the land I purchase of Collet & others of London including
the plantation he now lives on call the land Shale or pappy
leaving the upper branch lines stand, to the north of the
said boundaries for the five hundred acres which said pappy
and land I give to my son John Short his heirs forever
and further I give to my son William Short one hundred acres
of land be the same more or less, it being the land between
the gut in millers Island, also I give to my son William Short
about ten acres of land be the same more or less at it is now
left off, paying no taxes but the river including the barn
where the heirs forever I further give to my son William
Short two negro boys, old & sick which formerly belong
to my brother, and little Peter to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Mary Weston her negro boy Pampy
Shale to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give the walk unto my four other daughters Martha Short
Sarah Short, Penelope Short & Betty Short, four hundred
pounds current money of Virginia Cash to them & their
heirs forever. I also give to each of them one feather bed &
furniture to them & their heirs forever.

Item I give by my mark unto my son David Short six hundred & forty
acres of land be the same more or less on the ocean side pappy
