for the advantage of my said wife & her children
and the profits during the rent to be applied to her
Maintenance at the discretion of my said Executors
hereafter named

Sister I do never see & appoint my loving Wife & daughter
and my brother John Chappell. John Poyer & Mrs
Drury Lee & Mrs de Lellons shall be invited to this
my last Will & Testament & I am willing to make
all other & former Wills by me made & this only to be
had taken to be my true last Will
