Executors hereafter named - My worldly Estate I dispose

I now I give & bequeath unto my son Stephen Cobb one negro
girl named Liddy to him & his heirs forever -

I now I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Cobb one
negro girl named Fidd & one negro boy named
Dred to him & his heirs forever -

I now I give & bequeath unto my son Jesse Cobb one
negro girl named Rose to him & his heirs forever -

I now I send my beloved Wife Mary Cobb the use of my
negro manch Bep & the negro manch Cate during
her widowhood & after her widowhood I give the
negro manch Bep & the negro manch Cate they & their
heirs to my son Abraham Cobb & my son John
Cobb & my daughter Pussilla Cobb & my daughter
Sarah Cobb to be equally divided between each and
every of them - And I do hereby appoint John
Deberry, Henry Deberry, & Peter Deberry and
Abraham Starnson to divide the negro manch Bep

chest & give to him & his heirs forever.

Items. I give to my dear John four chairs, to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give to my son Abraham (bott four Chans, to have this mine forever.

Steno. I have to my beloved wife Mary Cobb the land and Plantations whereon I now live, and all the land that I now possess of during her widowhood, having the use of the said Land without any disturbance or interruption -

Item. I give & bequeath to my son absalom Cobb the land
whereon now live containing one hundred & sixty
acres more or less preserving the use of the said
land to his mother during her widowhood to ab-
salom Cobb & his heirs forever.

Then I give & bequeath to my son John Cobb the land and Plantation that I purchased of Arthur Stearnson containing one hundred & twenty five acres more or less reserving the use of the said land & Plantation to his mother during her old age - to John Cobb him & his heirs forever -

Now I leave to my ~~dear~~ beloved Wife Mary Cobb the use of
of all the remaining part of my Estate, that is to say,
Cattle, hog, & tithing stock, household goods & furniture
of whatsoever kind, after the payment of my just debts
and Legacies during her widowhood - and after her
widowhood I give to my son John Cobb and my son

Abelove Cobb all the remaining part of my estate that
is not already given before to be equally divided be-
tween my son John Cobb & my son Abelove Cobb to
each of them their heirs forever - And I do here by
appoint John Deberry Henry Deberry & Peter Deberry
and Abraham Stearns to divide the said estate
after my wife's death equally between my son
John Cobb and my son Abelove Cobb to them
& their heirs forever.

I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary Cobb sole
 executrix of this my last will & testament signed with
 my own seal the 14th day of October one thousand seven
 hundred & sixty five. ⁱⁿ Robert Cobb ^{main} ^{field}
 signed sealed published & attested by the said Robert Cobb
 as his last will & testament in presence of
 us John Deberry, Henry Deberry, Joseph Strickland & his wife
 Northampton County, Newber Court 1767.
