CHARLES COTTON WILL

In the name of God Amen. I Charles Cotton of the province of North Carolina & County of Northampton, being in a corporeal state of health but thinking before of good Lord authorizing mind & memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life am willing to make this my last will & testament in following manner & form, that is first I give my soul to almighty God that gave it me Humbly beseeching him to take me into his fatherly hands & to accept me in the right way that leads to life Eternity, knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, & my body to be buried at the

discretion of my executors here after named, & my funeral expenses discharged, I do give & bequeath as follows etc.

Item I give & bequeath unto my brother William Cotton one negt. Mareh called Brule & his increase to him & his heirs forever also I give to my brother William Cotton one bay horse called Puff & my saddle & bridle to him forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my brother Robert Cotton my Plantation Land there unto belonging to him & his heirs forever also give to my brother Robert Cotton one grey horse called Gray taken forever

Item It is likewise my will & desire that all my other estate both goods & chattels shall be equally divided between my above mentioned brothers Wm. Cotton & Robert Cotton.

I do nominate & appoint my will before Brothers Robert Cotton my whole & sole Executer of this my last will & testament reserving & disannulling all former wills by me made & sealing my hand thereto this 10th day May 1763.
