In the name of god Amen I here testify of Northhamblen County & State of Northcarolina being at present sick & weak of body but in perfect health sound mind & memory thanks to god and therefore calling to mind the frailty of my Body to make & ordain this my last

Will & Testament that is to say first I woult that all my actual debts be paid and discharged

Item

I give to my son Rhodes Washley four hundred and thirty acres of Land lying up Swamps Swamps beginning at the mouth of the middle branch then up the branch through the head to the silver Cab then down the silver Cab to the patent line then a long the side line to a corner black Jack then up Swamps Road to Swamps Swamps then down the Swamps to Benjamin Tanners line then a long his line to a corner then still a long line marked down to the great branch then down the branch to the Swamps Swamp then down the Swamps to the beginning also one man one feather bed & furniture to him and his heirs forever

Item

I give to my son Samuel Washley three hundred acres of Land and plantation whereon I now live after my wife deceas also the one half of my Will I give to my son Rhodes Washley also I give to my son Samuel Washley one fifty and one feather bed & furniture

Item

I give to my daughter Elizabeth Washley one feather bed and furniture

Item

I give to my daughter Mary Washley one feather bed and furniture

Item

I give to my grand daughter Elizabeth Washley

Item

I give to my son James Washley one feather bed & Furniture All the remainder my estate within Dons & Without I give to my said wife during her life and at her death I give the same to be equally divided among all my children my desire is that my son Rhodes Washley & Samuel Washley should ~~inherit~~ ^{maintain} my said James Washley I do constitute and appoint my son Rhodes Washley my sole & sole executor of this my last Will & Testament. Revoking making void all other Wills heretofore made by me in Wills whereof I have heretofore set my hand and seal this 21st March 1784

In the name of god Amen I John Cotton of Northhamblen County & State of Northcarolina being sick & weak in body but a perfect memory Do make this my last will & Testament First I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty god my creator & my body I commit to the earth to be decently entred and as touching my worldly estate I give and devise

of the same in the following manner To wit
 I give & bequeath to my Son Joel Cotton
 with his male heir the Land & plantation
 whereon the said Joel now lives which
 being Land purchased of John Parker,
 Nicholas Braggell, John Woods James Rogers
 and George Gorne & Joseph Smith lying
 in Halifax County to him with his
 male heir forever and for want of such
 heir or heirs the said Land to fall to
 my son Allen Cotton should said
 Allen Cotton die before he comes to the
 age of twenty one years the said Land
 to fall to my son Willie Cotton. I also
 give to my son Joel Cotton one negro
 man named Grand one girl named
 Bob. one other named Sister & one negro
 woman named Judy which said Negro
~~with~~ said Joel has now in possession

I give & bequeath to my son Henry Cotton
 Part with his male heir the manors plan-
 tation whereon I now live and the Land there to
 belonging also the Land I bought of Isaac
 Campbell known by the name of Wozyle
 place also the Land & plantation I bought
 John Daughtry also the Land & plantation
 my Father bought of James Cook also
 the Land & plantation I bought of Arthur
 Cotton also the Land I bought of James
 Poole the above said Lands lying in
 Northampton County one piece Division
 Land lying in Bertie County to him
 with his male heir or heirs forever &
 for want of such heir or heirs the said
 Land to fall to my son John Cotton

Should the said John my son die
 before he comes to the age of twenty one
 years the said Lands to fall to my son
 James Cotton first

I give to my Daughter Mary Abington
 one negro woman named Cinah one girl
 named Wand & one boy named Jack the
 two small negroes now in her possession &
 if she and her heirs lawfully begotten of
 her body die before the said heir come to
 the age of twenty one years then the said
 negroes to fall back to my estate and
 be equally betwixt my son Josiah Childers
 & my Daughter Sally

Item

I give to my Daughter Sally Thomas one
 Negro woman named Lucy one girl named
 Sally one boy named Solomon and if she
 die without Issue lawfully begotten on
 her body or her heirs die before they come
 to the age twenty one years then the
 said Negroes given to my Daughter Sally
 to fall to my son Josiah Childers and
 for my son William Cotton Part to be
 equally divided the said Josiah Childers
 & William.

Item

I give to my son William Cotton Part
 the Land and plantation I bought of James
 Campbell also the Land & plantation I bought
 of John & Robert Young also the Land &
 plantation I bought of Samuel Cunnings
 also the Land & plantation I bought of Thomas
 Minton also all my Lands that lies in
 Bertie County therefore that I bought of James
 Poole to him & his heirs forever also I give
 to my son William Cotton Part one negro

boy named Sam if the said William Cotton Part die before he comes to the age of twenty one years then the whole of this Legacy to fall to the eldest of his Brothers that have no Land also I give to my son William Cotton Part the half of the plantation working tools one yoke of Oxen Cart &c. Sheds to one Gray Man I bought of John King,

Item I give to my son James Cotton Part the Land and plantation I bought of James Stewart lying in Chatham County to him & his heirs forever if the said James die before he comes to the age of twenty one years then the said Lands to fall to the eldest of his Brothers that have no Land & for want of such Brother then the said Lands to fall to my son Henry Cotton Part also I give to my son James Cotton Part one large black man

Item I give to my son Allan Cotton the Land & plantation when my Brother Benjamin Cotton now lives my Brother Benjamin die wecepted in said Land to the said Allan & his heirs forever also I give to my son Allan one filly called Buckskin also I give to my son Allan Cotton the plantation & Land I bought of William George & James Petty in Chatham County to him and his heirs forever.

Item I lend to my living Wife Mary Cotton during her Widowhood the Negroes following to wit George, Toby, Willie, Darcas, Lydia, Phela, Nellie, Perry, Davy and all my Negro Children for the purpose of raising & main-

ing of my eight small Children also I lend to my Wife during her Widowhood her choice of 3 of my best horses 10 cows & calves 10 Ewes & Lambs also all the feather bees & Furniture that is not given away My Will & Desire is after my Wifes Widowhood that all the Negroes should be equally divided between my eight Children to wit William Part James Cotton Part Henry Cotton Part Allen Cotton Willie Cotton Johnathan Cotton John Cotton and Mary Cotton

Item I give to my son Willie Cotton one Negro named Buckel to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Johnathan Cotton one Negro Girl Annaky to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son John Cotton one Negro Girl named Venus to him & his heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Cotton one Negro Girl named Aggy to her & her heirs forever

Item All the remainder part of my Estate not given away My Will & Desire is should be equally divided between my eight small Children (to wit) William Cotton Part, James Cotton Part, Henry Cotton Part, Allen Cotton, Willie Cotton, Johnathan Cotton, John Cotton & Mary Cotton to them & their heirs forever. Should my Wife have a child in mine months after my decease my desire is that that Child shall have an equal part with the above eight Children

Item I now constitute and confirm these following William Cotton Part, James Cotton Part & Henry Cotton Part to be my lawful Sons and they shall inherit as Lawful Heirs of

of my body with the rest of their Wives
that is to say I and Colored In the Will
Johnathan Cotton and John Cotton being
Loved Sons by my second Wife

I give to my Daughter in Law Elizabeth
Cotton and her three Children four Heirs with
their first Wives

I do hereby nominate and appoint my Son
Isaac Cotton and my trusting friend Samuel
Williams and William Williams of Martin
County my whole & sole executors of this
my Last Will & Testament Signed with my
Hand & sealed with my Seal this 6th day
of September in the year of our Lord 1782

eighty three, I John Duke of Northampton County North
Carolina being in perfect mind and memory thanks
be to almighty God for the same & calling to mind
that it is appointed for all men to die, I do hereby
make and declare this to be my last will & Testament
hereby recommending of my soul into the hands of my
Creator and my body to be buried at the discretion
of my executors hereafter named, and as touching
my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God
God to bless me with, my just debts & funeral Expenses
being first paid by my said executors, I give & dispose
of the same in the following manner.

Item It is my will & desire that my beloved wife Sarah
Duke do have equal use of my plantation wherewith
I dwell & the lands thereunto belonging & attached hereto
this my said will also that she do have privilege of man-
king use of any of my other lands hereto before
for her support she not to hinder & disturb my daughter
Mary she husband and family living with her in the
now dwelling house and making use with herem my
land & plantation for the support & use with herself
and it is further my will & desire that her continuance
to be & remain as one family.

Item I give & bequeath unto my said wife my negro
named Will, Charles, Sam, Luke, Huger & her sons
Gideon & grant to her & her disposal.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Ann Sumner my
two negroes named Joe & Carter to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my two grandsons John & Joseph
Sumner my two negroes they I have already delivered
them & entered possession to them & their heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Charlotte
Sumner my negro girl named Lucy & her increase which
is now in her father Joseph Sumners possession to her & her
heirs forever.
