DAVID DICKINSON'S WILL

In the name of God Amen of Northampton County State of North
Carolina being weak of Body but of sound perfect mind &
Memory Thanks be to Almighty God for the same, but Calling to
mind the mortality of our nature & that it is appointed for
man once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & Testa-
ment, in manner & form following, that is to say first I con-
fess unto my soul into the hand of Almighty God who gave
it hoping for acceptance with him, through the merits of our
Lord Jesus Christ, & my Body to be decently Buried as the
Custom of my Country hereafter named & as touching my
worldly Estate which, It hath been pleased God to Bless
me with, I give & dispose of them in the following manner (viz)

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson the land & Planta-
tion whereon I now live with all the appurtenances thereunto be-
longing, containing be Estimation One hundred & fifty Acres,
be the same more or less, to him his heirs forever.

I also give & devise unto my said son David Dickinson all the
Lands which my Brother Isaac Dickinson gave me by will
Containing two hundred & 20 acres adjoining the land aforesaid near
Lan on the North side of the Plantation between the Runy branch
the little branch to him his heirs forever.

Item I also give & devise unto my said son David Dickinson the
land & Plantation which I bought of Isaac Dickinson & ad-
joining the land & Plantation whereon I now live containing
two hundred & 20 acres (the number of acres may be seen
fully appear) to him this heirs forever.

Item I also give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson the
land & Plantation I bought of Isaac Barber &c adjoining the
lands of Kinners & Kinners (the number of acres may be seen
In the Book of Sale, To him this heirs For ever.)

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson the land & Plantation
which I bought of Jeremiah Houghton lying on the West side
of the Plantation whereon I now live to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson the land
& Plantation which I bought of Henry Smith lying on the South
side of Cutawhicker marsh & appurtenances being had to the
Book of Sale will more fully appear to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson a certain
parcel of Marsh ground which I purchased of James Wood
adjoining the lands in which I now live the number of acres
may be known by the Book of Sale to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson all that
tract or parcel of land which I bought of David Dickinson
on the South side of Blueasy Creek with all & singular
the lands, & premises, & appurtenances thereunto belonging
to him his heirs forever.

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson the follow-
ing Negroes (viz) Frank, Nancy Jacob, Bep, Daniel,
Anacy, Moses, London, Dereas, Donah, Samsy, Tom,
& Rachel, to him this heirs forever.

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my son David Dickinson two hun-
dred pounds in gold to him at the Rate of one Shilling
per Dollar, To be paid to him at the age of twenty one years, To
him this heirs forever.

Item I give & devise by way of gift unto my Daughter Priscilla Wil-
liam's four Negroes which is now in his care
