In the name of God amen I Henry Crittenden of Northampton County State of North Carolina being of sound mind & memory do constitute this my last will & testament in manner & form following Testis
 Item I give unto my Daughter Francis Green five Dollars.
 Item I give unto my Son Henry Crittenden five negroes, viz, Lucy, Jim Hammon, Sam Blannew to him this heirs forever.
 Item I give to grand son Henry Brandon negro girl named Nisha to him this heirs forever.
 Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Tynes one negro woman named Caprice to her this heirs forever.
 Item I give to my Grand Son Mest Tynes one negro girl named Hester to him this heirs forever.
 Item I give to my Grandson Henry Tynes one negro Boy, named Larse to him this heirs forever.
 Item I give to my Son in Law Alastair Tynes my riding Horse saddle & my Bed of furniture which I give & all my aching apparel to him this heirs forever.
 Item I leave my Negro Fellow Tom Wilson Henry Crittenden & Frederick Green to them their heirs forever.
 Item in consider & desire is that as much of the residue of my Estate as I shall discharge my debts & the surplus I give to my son Robert Crittenden to him this heirs forever and also appoint my son Robert & Henry Crittenden my executors published & sealed to be my last. Henry Crittenden has seal

In the name of God amen this second day of February One thousand seven hundred Eighty three Edwin Bridges of Northampton County & province of North Carolina being sick weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to God & calling to mind the uncertain state of this transitory life knowing that all flesh must yield to death when it shall please God to call them I do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in manner & form following first I give my soul into the hands of God who gave it to me nothing troubling but to receive the same again by the mighty power of God & my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my friends hereafter leaving such worldly goods wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give ^{to his} ~~myself~~ ^{myself} ~~manus~~ ^{manus} in form following I leave to my beloved wife Mary Bridges the use of my man or plantation tract of land also I now live until my son John comes of age & after he comes of age I leave the third of my plantation tract of land during his life also I leave the use of my moveable estate to raise my children & qualify them come of age & also I leave to my wife my two negroes Caddie & Hosie during her life Then I give to my son John Bridges my manor plantation tract of land wherein I now live with all my possements lands & also my negro boy Dick to him & his heirs forever. Item I give ^{my} ~~my~~ ^{my} ~~my~~ to my son Edwin Bridges my negro boy Jim to him his heirs forever. Item I give my negroes to my Daughter Elizabeth Bridges my negro girl Sol to her this heirs forever. Item I give ^{my} ~~my~~ ^{my} ~~my~~ to my daughter Eliza & my negro boy Thomas & my negro girl Sally to her this heirs forever. And of this my last will & testament which make none else happy & assist my truly & well beloved friends John Drakewen Junr his husband Jordan my whole estate executors Ratifying & Confirming this now other & as my last will & testament
