In the name of god Amen this thirly first day of
 January One thousand seven hundred and Eighty
 four I Joshua Daughtery of Northampton County
 being sick and weak in body and calling to mind
 the uncertain state of this transitory life that
 I must submit to death when it is pleased the
 Lord to call and am in perfect mind and memory
 thanks be to god for the same and I do make
 this my last will and testament in
 manner and form following that is to say first
 of all that all my Just debts to be paid first
 I lend the use of my plantation and negroes and all
 my Estate to my beloved wife Elizabeth Daughtery
 during her natural life and after death

I give and bequeath to my grand Children that
 proved from my daughter Lucretia Campbell
 the wife of William Campbell five shillings
 at being their part of my Estate to them
 and their heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Howell
 the wife of Stephen Howell for it being her part
 of my Estate to her & her heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my son Eleajah Daughtery
 five shillings to him and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my son Olisha Daughtery
 five shillings at being his part of my Estate
 to him & his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my grand Daughter
 Elizabeth Sattins the daughter of Bury Sattins

And Mary his wife One negro girl named Miller
and a pack saddle and a blue Chest to her
and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Anne
getting the daughter of Benj Gattins and
Mary his wife One bed & furniture One blue chest
two Plates dishes and six plates two Basins
and one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary
Futrell the wife of John Futrell my
plantation wherein I now dwell and all
my land and my negro man Dick and my negro
woman Vilet and all the rest of my Estate
to her & her heirs forever And I do appoint
my beloved wife Elizabeth Daughton and my

March One thousand seven hundred and Eighty four
I Isaac Lapsiter of Hampton County State
of North Carolina being sick in body but of good
and sound memory Thanks be to god for the same
and calling to mind the uncertain Estate of this
transitory life and that all flesh must
yield to death when it shall be pleased god
to call do make constitute Ordain and declare
this to be my last will & testament in manner
and form following reciting disarming
by these presents all and Every Other testament
Or Testaments Will or Wills by me heretofore
made by me and declare this to be my last
will & testament and as Other and just being
sorry for my past sins most humbly desire
forgiveness for the same and now for the settling
of my temporal Estate and such gods chattels
and debts as it hath pleased god to bestow upon me
I do order and give and dispose the same in
manner and form following that is to say first
that all Just debts and dues be paid within convenient
time after my decease by my Executors hereof named

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Isabella Rogers
the wife of Abraham Rogers five shillings
to her & her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucrecia
Belanchard five shillings to her & her heirs forever

Item I give unto my son James Lapsiter five shillings
to him & his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Isaac Lapsiter
all my land on the north East side of the neck
Barnes containing One hundred and ten Acres
to him and his heirs and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Lapsiter
