Henry Dawson's Will

In the name of God Amen I Henry Dawson
of Northampton County ⁱⁿ Province of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory, thanks be to God, but calling to mind the mortality of mankind & knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, make & ordain Constitute & Appoint this my last will & testament, in manner & form following to wit:

I give to my son John Dawson, his heirs & assigns forever my Plantation & all the lands thereunto belonging, which I bought of Thomas Hart in the County of Edgecomb or Somers Swamp & in case my said son John die before he arrives to lawfull age or marriage, then I give the said land & plantation to my son Stephen Dawson, his heirs & assigns forever.

Item I give to my son Henry Dawson his heirs & assigns the following tracts of land lying in the County of Northampton to wit, one hundred acres being the plantation whereon I now live, also one hundred acres of land which I bought of William Cotton & Eliza his wife, in said County also two tracts joining each other on Roanoke River, in the law ground containing about three hundred & twenty acres each tract: & also three hundred acres in said County being the plantation which I bought of John Wilson in said County. & in case my said son Henry Dawson die before he arrives to lawfull age or marriage, then I give all the lands mentioned to him to say son Stephen except those hundred acres bought of John Wilson.

Item I give herewith unto my son Stephen Dawson his heirs & assigns forever, the following tracts of land in the County of Edgecomb to wit, two tracts of land on Tar Creek containing about six hundred acres, also one tract lying in Conants Precinct, containing about three hundred acres.

Item I give herewith to my living wife Eleazar Dawson her heirs & assigns, one negro woman named Frank.

Item I give herewith the remainder of my whole estate consisting of every kind whatsoever, that is not herein before mentioned or given in legacies, to be equally divided between my wife Eleazar my three sons herein before & my two daughters Mary Dawson & Patty Dawson & their heirs & assigns. I have made & share make & share make Lastly I nominate Constitution & appoint my living wife Eleazar & my trustee Friend Dr. Peter Hobson Kinchen &c. to execute this my last will & testament hereby revoking & disannulling all other Wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the 5th day of May 1770 signed sealed & declared by... *Henry Dawson & seal*

this said Henry Dawson to be his last will & testament in presence of us. *Elizabewin, William Danner, William Williams*

& it is known to all men by these presents that whereas I Henry Dawson of the County of Northampton & Province of North Carolina have made & declared my last will & Testament in writing, bearing date 5th day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred forty four. I the said Henry Dawson do by this my last will & Testament confirm & ratify my last will & Testament & do give herewith unto my son Stephen Dawson, all that my service or tract of land I bought of John Hardell, situate lying being in the County of Edgecomb with the appurtenances, to have & to hold to him his heirs forever, also all my stock of Cattle & Hogs on the said premises, to have & to hold them his heirs forever, and my will & meaning is that the Codicil or Schedule be & held & judged part & parcel of my said last will & Testament.

End that the things herein Contained & mentioned be faithfully
truly performed & faithfully & amply in every respect as of the
same as in Scotland & set Down in my said last will &
testament. In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand

William Andrew Will

In the name of God amen. I William Andrew of North-
ampton County, being very sick & weak in body but of a
perfect mind & memory thank be unto God for the same.
Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life & knowing
it is appointed for all men once to die, I make & ordain this
my last will & testament, revoking & disannulling all other
will or wills heretofore made by me. And first of all I give
my soul to God that gave it me relying on the merits of my
beloved Saviour to have full pardon for all my sins & as for my
worldly Goods as God hath blessed me with I give & dispose
as followeth to wit.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Gray Andrews, three negroes
called Edy, Ale & Steele & one Dog Chain.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Abraham Andrews, three ne-
groes, called Hannah, Bill & Sam & two iron & wood &
my Carpenter Tools.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Abraham Andrews, my Land &
Plantation & eight Cattle six Sheep.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William Andrews four negroes
called, Gato, Allen, Sue & Sam; one feather bed of a mixture

Eight pounds Proo, Six Shgs & Carpenter Tools.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Gran Andrews four negroes cal-
led Bill, Tom, Amy & Edy, one feather bed & furniture eight
pounds Proo, Six Shgs.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Gran Andrews my Turners tools
which makes do to my little Gun.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Averilla Andrews, to her &
her Heirs lawfully begotten of her body four negroes Cal-
led Phyllis, Maria, Cherry & Lewis, one feather bed & furniture.

Item I give to my beloved wife Martha Andrews one negro Cal-
led Abigail & four head of cattle.

Item I lend the labour of four negroes, called Ben Phyllis Sally &
Cate, the use of one feather bed & furniture during her widow-
hood.

Item I leave my ready money after the payment of my just
debts to be equally divided between Gray Andrews, Abraham
Andrews, and son, William Andrews, Gran Andrews & her eld.
daughter Averilla.

Item The remaining part of my estate which I have not given
away to be equally divided between William Andrews,
Gran Andrews, and Averilla Andrews, after my wife
is deceased, I do appoint Gray Andrews, Abraham
Andrews & William Andrews my whole estate & rest of this
my last will & testament, Feby 25th 1778.
