Lastly I appoint John Neword whole estate executor of this my last will & testament, & do hereby nominate & make my other former will & to ratify & confirm this and none other to be my last will & testament.

In the name of God amen I John Dawson of the County of Pamlico in the Province of North Carolina, now in perfect health and of sound disposing mind & memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this transitory life am willing to make my last will & testament in manner & form following that is to say, First I beguare my soul to almighty God that gave it me, and my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors, and also my just debts are paid, I give & beguare the rest of my

Estate as follows the next First & foremost my wife Anna is that out of my share of general Debt due to me and what gold & silver I have by me and my Stock of Cattle at her death my wife and my marriage Contract may be made good & therefor plus age of a negotiable & quality Service between my three small children Charles Dawson, Elizabeth Dawson & John Dawson, Item I give & beguare unto my son Henry Dawson the Plantation wherein he now lies and the land adjoining thereto, thuroughing at the Center of the Crooked Meadow at Alexander Thomasons line that divides his land & mine, & along the said Crooked Meadow round about Dawson, otherwise known as the, it Coms to the line that crosses the said meadow run in the neck, called by the will neck the Land & Plantation for three hundred acres he it never left to him & his heirs forever, also giving to my son Henry Dawson my land & Plantation I bought of Maurice Moore as by his Deed to me did appear, also my Glass Plantation and the land thereto belonging for six hundred of forty acres, as by the will Coms to me & their Patent will appear, also one hundred acres of land in Carter County which I bought of John Wilson, all my land on the River Neuse to be in these parcels & in the whole about four hundred acres as by Patent of King George will take the above said lands to give to my son Henry Dawson to him & his heirs forever, also I give to my son Henry my young horse called Jaumon and Maurice Moores Debts only being I give unto my son John Dawson my Plantation wherein he now lies with all the land on the plantation side the Crooked Meadow (viz) that I bought of John Smith & Richard Brice also one hundred of forty acres on the north side of bridge Creek joining to George Pollock's Land as per eas of ground side & as will appear my land on neather Swamps as by Mathew Williams Deed to me will appear my land on Pollock's Creek as per patent record or any part of the aforesaid Lands and all the improvements & improvements of any kind to the same or to any part thereof anguished

- Item I bequeath him the said John Dawson & his heirs forever
my will desire is that my living wife Charity Dawson
live on my Manour Plantation during her natural
life & keep the house & other valuable improvements in
reasonable repair also I give to my son John my
Clock & Chest upon a Chest ^{with} Drawers & two oval tables
one chamber table which stands in the room called
the Green Room & my Carpet looking glass which stands in the hall
- Item I give all my right title & interest to a girl called Dinah
the slave man of mine to my daughter Elizabeth Dawson.
- Item I give to my living wife Charity Dawson the negro woman Callie
Ganny which was given to her by her deceased father,
- My will desire is that my said wife have a negro boy named
Nunford & the will except of him in lieu of a negro fellow
Called Peter belonging to her estate which she paid the said
for forty five pounds Virginia money & the will not
except of the said boy for that fellow my further will &
desire is the said boy be sold to make out the sum of
forty five pounds Virginia money for which the said
fellow was sold for
- Item I give to my son Henry Dawson the following negro slave
York Galucow & Sam. at Island & Mingo, two hundred pounds
British & the daughter of Leah young lady there to him the said
Henry this his heir forever
- Item I give to my three young Children Charity Dawson, Elizabeth Dawson
and John Dawson, to them & their heirs forever, to be equally divided
as when the first of the three Children shall arrive to law
ful age, to be married, & the property of their later if any to be
equally divided between.
- Item I give to my granddaughter Martha Lincklin & wife
Lincklin Mary Lincklin & Temperance Lincklin thirty pounds
Virginia money each to be paid out of my Estate when
they shall arrive at lawfull age & married
- Item I give to my two Grandsons John Lincklin & William
Lincklin ten shillings Virginia money each -

- Item I give to my wife & the widow of my Estate after to the legacies are
paid & my wife's contract is completed with, to my three children
Charity Dawson, Elizabeth Dawson & John Dawson & their heirs
forever
- Item I give to my wife & my living wife Charity Dawson my riding chair
charmp & also do nominate & appoint my said living wife Charity
Dawson executrix of this my will, & this lawn to be my last will
testament revoking & disallowing all former or other wills or testaments
