WILL OF BRADFORDS WILL

In the name of God Amen, I John Bradford of the County
of Northampton Province of North Carolina being sick & weak
in body but of perfect sense & memory thanketh to Almighty
God for the same, do make this my last will & testament
First, I give & bequeath my soul to Almighty God that made it
and my body to be buried by my executors, and have thought
to dispose of my Estate in manner following &c.

Item I leave to my living wife Mary Bradford my Plantation where
we now live, & my mill & a Negroe fellow named, Ned, and
a negroe woman named Lucy & six Cows & a bull, belonging to
the Plantation where we now live, one black mare named
Linen, one lot of pasture & four Barn pots, one hillside where
I may so long the same live, a field, & after death or mar-
riage to be divided between my two sons William &
Henry Bradford their heir forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Ann Bradford my Plantation
where we now live, beginning at a Spanish red oak on the
ridge & running my son Richard Bradford's line to a live
pine thence along the line of marked trees to a corner
red oak on Richard's plantation to him other heirs forever,
Also giving to my son Richard Bradford one negro boy named
Peter, and my other & a bed & furniture & one horse Colt
& my Smith's tools & them to his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Henry Bradford a parcel
of land containing two hundred acres more or less
beginning on Ricks Spanish line & a road line made to
between Ann Bradford & the Henry Bradford, & also

give to my son Henry Bradford one acre of land named
Bam to him other heirs forever
Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Edith Bradford one acre of land
named Black & one bed & furniture to her other heirs forever
Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ruth Bradford one negro boy
named Ned, to her & her other heirs forever
Item I give & bequeath to Elizabeth Bradford one shilling
Proclamation money.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Bradford one hundred
acres more or less, laying his swaggerty road where
John Richardson now lies, also give him my close bedded
white coat & one negroe fellow & one to him other heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Richard Bradford one parcel of
land containing one hundred forty acres more or less
laying in Orange County on Little Creek & a negroe boy
Called Gibb, & one negroe boy called Jim whom I have given to
him other heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Thomas Bradford for all my Island Land
to him other heirs forever.

Item I do appoint my living wife & my son Nathaniel Bradford my
whole sole executors & executrix of this my last will & testa-
ment, Let do appoint the said executors to sell all my stock of
all kinds & pay all my just & lawful debts, witness my
hand seal this 23rd day of May 1762 Thomas Bradford & his
wife, John Bradford, Wm Brooks,

STTHON D. EDWARD'S WILL

In the name of God Amen, I John Edwards of Northampton
County, in the province of North Carolina being sick & weak in

body but of sound mind & memory, doth begin to Almighty
by God to make & contain this my last will & Testament. First
I command my soul to almighty God, in full hopes of
future happiness, my body ^{to be} decently buried at the ex-
ecution of my Deed & hereof I name my worldly estate
Settispace of in manner & form following. etc.

Item I give & bequeath unto Henry Deberry the son of Benjamin
Deberry deceased the Plantation which two hundred acres
land lying on Company Swamp wherein his father lately
lived to him & his heirs forever, also all the Stock & merchandise
in the possession of the widow & during may be divided between
her & her children according to law.

Item I give to my beloved wife Jane Deberry the use of my negro
man Wendor & a negro girl Phillie, during natural
life, & after the death I give the negro man Wendor
to my son Peter Deberry & the negro girl Phillie to my
son John Deberry, to each & one of them forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Peter Deberry of Plantation wherein
he now livs containing two hundred acres but more or less,
beginning at the mouth of the mill swamp, in the river up of
Sampson Debary, line to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Solomon Deberry three hundred
acres a tract lying between Company & Hurley Creek,
purchase of Matthew Strickland, one negro man named
Dinge, one negro boy named Coffe & one feather bed, eight
head of cattle, great & small together, two sows with Pig
to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Deberry a negro
boy named Pimp, one negro boy named Glasew, eight
head of cattle great & small, one feather bed, two sows
with Pig, also twenty five pounds Virginia money
three pounds five shillings & four pence of which sum is
now in his hands to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Deberry of Plantation
whereon he now livs containing two hundred acres more

or less beginning at the mouth of my Spring branch up the said
branch to below up the bottom to a line of marked trees along
the said line of marked trees to the head of Pole bridge branch down
the said branch to little swamp, to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son David Deberry my Plantation where
on he now livs containing three hundred acres more or less, beginning
at the mouth of my Spring branch up the said branch to a line
of marked trees, along that line to the head of Pole bridge branch
down the branch to the little swamp, up the S swamp to
John Brister line along his line to the river, his mother having
the use of the said land & Plantation during her life with
out any disturbance & interruption to my son David Deberry
during his life & his heirs forever also I give my said Son David
Deberry three negroes named, Tony James & Simon.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Cobb, one negro
girl named Kate to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Thrusen one negro
girl named Hannah to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Priscilla Pope, one negro
girl named Dope to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Peter Deberry and his heirs
one third part of my land over the little swamp up the rocky branch.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Edward Deberry this heirs, one
third part of the said land,

Item I give & bequeath unto my son George Deberry this heirs the
remaining third part of the above mentioned land to be equally
divided between each & one of them.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son George Deberry all the remain-
ing part of my estate, that is to say, cattle hogs & other Stock,
house hold goods of不分 of whatsoever kind, after paying
my just debts, & expenses herein before mentioned, reser-
ving the use of all & thing at all the premises aforesaid during
her natural life, and then Deberry, my loving wife to be
by her made use of in the most frugal manner.

Item I give to my son George Deberry all the ready money sum

now pappeared for his own proffers, barely remonstrating
against my son & daughter Debry, sole executors of
this my last will & testament. Signed with my own hand
sealed with my seal the second day of December one
thousand seven hundred and sixty two.
Signed sealed published & witnessed by John Debry & sealed
by the said John Debry as his last
will & testament in presence of us.

Richard Hyde Will

In the name of god amen, I Richard Hyde of Northampton
County being to mind the mortality of my body that it is
apprained for all men once to die do here make my
last will & testament in manner & form following,
Imprimis I give Abiquash to my son Henry Hyde my tract of land
in Northampton County lying in Cedar run containing
thirty acres of land & there to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give Abiquash to my son Lucas Hyde two hundred
acres of land lying in Warwick County in the mid-
dle fork Creek, adjoining James Williams & David Hyde
& James Williams to lay of beginning where my said brother
Liam Europa the Coblen branch of ran thence to the upper
line westerly to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my wife Miland Hyde three negroes, to wit,
Jacob Polly, Burmude, during her widow hood sat
her marriage & death I give my negro man named
Jacob & man named Polly, & give to my son Lucas

Hyde but in case either of my said sons die without issue
lawfully begotten that this part or portion ^{there} equally divided
between my other two sons, viz, the survivors of the aforesaid
said sons & my son Hartwell Hyde.

Item My wife being now with child if it please god shall be safely de-
livered of it & give the first child that my wife so menah burmude
shall bear & live in the time of my wife's widowhood to the child
that my wife is now bigg with.

Item I also bind to my wife all my stock of cattle, sheep & other
except my grey horse called Sampson during her widow hood,
also I bind to my said wife my household goods during
her widowhood except my four feather beds of furniture.

Item I give to my three sons to wit, Harry Hyde, Hartwell Hyde
& Lucas Hyde one feather bed of furniture apiece.

Item I also give to my wife Miland Hyde one feather bed of furniture
Item I give to my Daughter Anne & her boy friend Sampson.

Item my will is that at the marriage or death of my said wife, that
all the remainder of my stock, household goods be sold at
public sale and equally divided among my three sons
(viz, Henry Hyde, Lucas Hyde, Hartwell Hyde), & the child
that my wife is now bigg with.

Item I give to my daughter Leticia Hyde one negroe girl named
Sue to her she be her servant.

Item I give to daughter Sophie Hyde one negroe boy named Gillas
to her she be her servant.

Item I give to my daughter Lucy Hyde one negroe boy named
Moses to her she be her servant.

But if either of my said daughters dies without heir law-
fully begotten my desire is that their part I have be-
divided between the survivors of them,

Imprimis I give to my son Hartwell Hyde my plantation wherein he dwelt
and all my other lands which I have not disposed of to him his
heirs forever I also give to my son Hartwell Hyde one negroe
woman named Curander after the marriage or death of
my wife.
