Item after the Legacies herein my will given away be made good
I give devise & bequeath all the residue of my said Estate after
the decease of my said Mother to my said Brother Richard
Wale both Real & Personal to him & to his heirs & assigns forever

Lastly I do hereby nominate & constitute & ordain my said Brother
Richard Wale my whole sole Executor of this my last will and
Testament hereby Revoking & making null & void all former
wills & Testaments by me made & this only to be my last will &

Isaac Dickinson's Will

In the name of God amen, the twenty first day of
November in the year of our Lord God 1766, Isaac

Dickinson of Northampton County in North Carolina
being very sick of body but of perfect mind and
sound memory thanks be given to God therefor calling to
mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to dye, do make and
ordain this my last will & Testament, that is to say,
principally & first of all I recommend my soul
into the hands of God that gave it & for my body
I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Chris
tianlike & decent manner at the discretion of my
Executors, nothing doubting but that at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God & as touching such worldly
Estate where with it has pleased God to bless me with
in this life, I give devise & dispose of the same in
the following manner & form --

Item 1 I give & bequeath to my Wife Priscilla Dickinson
the use of all my land & her life, also three negroes,
to her own disposal, to dispose of in like manner as
she sees fit, Hardy, Tom, Doll, Rose, Cote, Dinah,
Bot, Dennis, Phoebe & old Bessy Greene, also my whole
Stock horses, cattle, Sheep, geese, & hogs, all my house
hold furniture & all the rest of my Estate --

Item 2 I give & bequeath unto my Brother David Dickinson
after my Wife's death a piece of Land beginning at the
mouth of the little Branch running along the Branch
to the head thereof a right straight to the head line
in the Folley Porcosen --

Item I give & bequeath to my Cousin Isaac Dickinson
to Daniel Dickinson all the rest of my Land where
on I now live to him & his heirs forever --

Item I give & bequeath unto my Cousin James Dickinson
two Acres and twenty Acres of Land in the Ford
County to him & his heirs forever --

Item I give & bequeath unto my Cousin John Dickinson

I do to Daniel Dickinson one Negro Mule I due to him
 & his heirs forever & this my last Will & Testament, I make
 & constitute, nominate & appoint Daniel Dickinson
 David Dickinson & my wife Priscilla Dickinson my
 whole & sole Executors, revoking & annulling of all former
 wills by me heretofore made, ratified & confirmed,
 this & no other being my last Will & Testament -
 Signed Sealed & published } Isaac Dickinson & a Son
 & delivered by the Testator to be my last Will & Testament
 in presence of us the Subscribers.

John Hughlett's Will

North Carolina Northampton County ss
 This day Peter Morgan & Matthew Brock personally
 appeared before me Henry Dawson one of his Majesty's
 Justices of the Peace for the said County North being of full
 lawful age & being sworn in due form of Law on the Holy
 Evangelist of Almighty God, Deposed & said that on the 26th
 day of December Anno Domini 1766 John Hughlett
 late of said County departed this life & made & ordained
 this verbal Will in manner & form following, to wit,
 In presence he gave & bequeathed his whole Estate both real & personal
 unto his loving wife Minney Hughlett so long as she re-
 mained a widow unless she behaved so as to give reason
 to believe that she would spend or make away with the
 Estate or married that then & in either such case the
 Estate should be equally divided between his wife & four

Children Viz. Ann Hughlett, William Hughlett, Minney
 Hughlett, John Hughlett & the Child that his 2d wife is now big
 with & it was also his will & desire that his 2d wife should
 maintain & raise his children on & out of the 2d Estate
 & the profits thereof & appointed Lyn Hise to sell part of
 the Estate to divide the whole among the Children in
 case his wife indulged or destroyed the said Estate or
 married before she sayeth not Certified under my hand

 Item I give & bequeath unto my son Arthur Gregory the Plantation
 known I know how & my Negro woman named Brown.
