Item I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Morgan all the land that I am now possessor of after my death & my wife deceased or at her death. Likewise give him all my Stock of Cattle & hogs, likewise give him all my moveable estate that him have payed of. Likewise give him my main bridle & saddle. Item I give to my son Joseph Morgan the above mentioned articles to have & to his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Aaron Morgan one shilling & three pence.

Item I give to my son Arnold & Morgan one shilling & three pence.

Item I give to my son Sampson Morgan one shilling three pence.

Item I give to my son Aaron Morgan one shilling three pence.

Item I give to my son Timothy Morgan one shilling three pence.

Item I give my daughter Mary Toler one shilling & three pence.

I do here constitute & make my son Joseph Morgan my sole & sole Executor of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand seal this 14th day December 1766.

Richard Moore's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Richard Moore of the Province of North Carolina in the County of Northampton being weak & in a declining condition do make & ordain this to be my last will & testament in manner & form following vizt. First. I recommend my soul to Almighty God the Giver, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and touching my worldly Estate I give & bequeath as follows.

Item I send to my Mother Elizabeth Glaner two negroes named Daniel & Lot during her natural life, after my Mother deceaseth my will desire is that all my Estate both real & personal Lands & negroes should be sold & the amount of the same to be equally divided between my 3 brothers & sister.

Item I do hereby appoint my Brothers William Moore & Nathaniel Moore my executors to this my last will & testament and I do hereby revoke all other made hereof, either by word or writing. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this Twenty Day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred forty six.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Brother Bartholomew Fugures that he act or partake of Land that I am possessed ^{with} in eitherwise Refer to him this his lawfully begotten son.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Brother Joseph Fugures all my wearing clothes.

Item I give & bequeath unto my brother William Fugures four hundred acres of land that is joining his own the money that he is owing me.

Item I give to my dear wife Elizabeth Birney, Mary Chapman & Elizabeth & their each ^{and} other child with the Negro remembrancer Fugures, also you and my beloved wife eight Negroes named Sam, Sandy, Jack, Pompey, Jacob, Ann, Peter, Nancy & one Copper still Cap, a worn Club & Pump & after paying my debts & legacies I give to all the remaining part of my Estate.

Also I give my beloved wife Mary Fugures whom I do believe is now able to make & ordain my only will & a copy of this my last will & testament & I do hereby utterly disallow Revoketh all, and all & every other former will, testament & legacy by me & done by me in any way before this time named & called Bequeath & Ratifying & Confirming thir and no other to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this the thirtyninth day of September one thousand seven hundred & sixtynine

James Washington Will

In the Name of God amen I James Washington of Northampton County being sick & weak in body but in perfect sound & Memory praise be to the Almighty God for it but knowing the uncertainty of our being here do make this my last will & testament as follows the Reserval ing & Reserving all other wills or testaments heretofore made by me.

I give & bequeath my soul to god that gave it me & my body on the merits of my beloved Saviour to have full remission of all my sins & my body to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named.

Item I give unto my dear & loving wife our feather bed rug & two pt. blankets & covers of sheets & one Negro woman named Grace & also the use of the plantation whereon I now live & the Labour of those Negroes during her natural life that is January Jacob & Sal & also the use of all the Horses Cattle & Hogs during her natural life.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Robert Washington one hundred acres of land wherein he may live to his use of his Body lawfully begotten & for want of such Heirs to descend to my Son Nicholas Washington & His son and also give my son Robert Washington one Negro fellow called Tom and one boy called Ralph to him and his heirs forever & also one negro fellow called Jacob & the death of his mother.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Benjamin Washington two hundred acres of land being the plantation whereon I now live the land to hold of the other side of the river in Northford County to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten & for want of such He is to descend to Nicholas Washington & his heirs forever I give to my son Benjamin Washington one Negro boy called Roger & after the death of his mother one Negro man called James to him & his heirs forever & further my desire is that my son Robert Washington may have timber off the land & a Negro in Northford County to build on his plantation if he desires.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Son John Washington this his heirs forever two hundred acres of land on the south side of Kirby Creek joining Arthur Washington's land & give him one Negro
