out of my Estate has purchased a new Barn & Stell & all rights to
Joseph Grant as his or other than the Title he has in Lieu of it
is to be returned to Thomas Pate in good order & sound, & I
do give & bequeath the said title I purchased of Bryan Hill
to our only daughter Nancy Pate to her & her heirs forever.
Item I give unto my wife old Justice, the said heirs forever also her
and husband Carolina Money.

Item I give also is after all my debts are paid at the death of my
wife except the land & plantation I bought of Thomas Bonn
& James Morgan in case fail to the heirs at law, all the remain-
der of my Estate which may be sold at publick vendue &
equally divided between them alike amongst my five chil-
dren Thos Pate, Richard Pate, Ann Pate, Mary Elliott
Nancy Pate & their descendants to take place that before of
any of my legatees should commence a suit at law about
this will that part of my Estate given to any or either of them
shall never wholly & entirely lie in the hand of my Executors &
Emilia Thomas Pate & Nancy Pate so then sole right & pro-
perty forever. And I hereby constitute & ordain my son Thos
Pate of North County Virginia Doctor of Physick & my
daughter Nancy Pate of Northampton County N Carolina
to be Executrix & Receivatrix of this my last will & testament
also hereby utterly & finally Release Elizabeth Giaannell attorney
or former Testament & his Legacys or Bequeath Herby

memory (thanks be to God) knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die & to make & renew this my last will &
testament first of all I recommend my soul to God that
gave it & my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian
burial at the discretion of my Executors here after named
I am leaving of my worldly Estate which has pleased God
to bless me with in this life I give & dispose in the follow-
ing manner & form.

Item I leave the use of my plantation to my loving wife Alice Esterton
till she & all the Land the same side the Great Branch un-
til she marries & then I give & bequeath the plantation & the
lands I have left to my wife according to the bouness unto
my son Henry Esterton to him this his also my son
and my old Jan forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my wife one Head of furniture also I
give to my wife my Gray Horse also to my wife my saddle
and bridle also I give to my wife all my stock of Cattle
Sheep & Hogs.

Item I give unto my son Henry Esterton all my land lying on the
north side of the Great Branch bounded as follows beginning
at the mouth of the great Branch to the line thence the
line to Monborn junction line thence to John Esterton's line
to Hunting Quarter Swamp then down the said swamp
to the first Station to him this his, also I give to my
son Henry Esterton one sloop & vessel & gear for his
use I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Esterton one bed
& furniture

I give Slugworth unto my Daughter Elizabeth Future
one bed & furniture

I give Slugworth unto my two youngest Daughters Anne
Future & Rachel Future all the remaining part of my
Household goods to be equally divided after my wife
marrys me before, my wife desire is that my Land I bought
of Humphrey Future shall be sold to discharge my debts &
nominate & appoint my loving wife Lydia Future & my
Brother Davis Future Executors of this my last Will &
Testament as witness my hand & seal the day & year above
written. signed sealed & delivered in
presence of us.

Henry Jordan's Will

In the Name of God amen. I Henry Jordan of Mecklenburg County & State
of North Carolina, being sick & weak but of perfect mind & memory, call
ing to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appoynted
for all men to die. I do make this my last Will & Testament
in the following principally & first of all. I do command my son
to sell & dispose of it humblye praying for the forgiveness of all my
transgressions through the merit of my only Saviour Jesus
Christ & my body I commit to the earth to be buried in a decent
Christian manner at the direction of my executors but leaving
such wauelde estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless
me with I give & dispose of the same in the manner & form
following

beginning my will & desire is that all my just debts & funeral expences
be paid - my will & desire is that my land be divided in the

following manner a line to be run according as my corn
field fence runs that is next to lands of Mr. John Patersons
the fence as far as it runs to be part of the line the SE & NW
of said line. I give Slugworth unto my son John Jordan
& all my land on the N.W. side. I give Slugworth unto my son
Batt Jordan to them & their heirs forever.

My will & desire is that my negro that I am possessed with
at my death be equally divided between my son Batt
Jordan & John Jordan to them & their heirs forever.

My will & desire is that one feather bed & furniture be sold all
my tobacco some part some corn in order to discharge my
lawful debts. And all the rest of my stock of Horses Hogs
Cattle & Sheep with all my Household furniture & all my
plantation utensils be equally divided between my sons Batt
& John Jordan to them & their heirs forever.

And I do hereby Recoke & Disavow all legacies bequests heretofore
made by me declaring this & no other to be my last & last testament.
And I do hereby nominate & appoint my Brother Benjamin
Jordan & Mr. blood Smith as executors to this my last Will &
Testament. In witness whereunto I have hereunto set my
hand & seal this twenty eight day of September in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Eighty.

of us Arthur Hart, Henry McCall, Warren Jordan
Anspur County 4th Decr 1780.
