John Patrall's Will

In the name of God amen I John Patrall of St. Barnabas
County being at present in perfect sound mind & memory
thank be to god for it therefore calling unto mind the mort-
tality of my body do make and declare this my last will &
testament in manner & form following first of all I command
that all my actual debts be paid before my estate distributed
Item I give the use of my plantation to my wife Martha
Patrall during her se istauctor & wher ever I now live and the
Mill & all the land thereunto belonging also the labour of
four negroes One Barwell, One mo. Simey also one man
Soddle and Bridle also three Cows & Calves the value whereof
hambur one feather bed & furniture also thirty head of hog
one Iron pot & a gong pan one Chest two poults Ham
two dishes four plates one wooden wheel an unrun wheel
& all the place on the plantation all the Coast & Coast or the
plantation at my death

Item I give thegirth unto my son Thomas giving my nego
woman named Siley & her increase to him this his forever
Item I give thegirth unto my son John Patrall his hundred acre
of land where ever he now lives to him this his forever also one
negro boy named Elyck to him this his forever

Item I give thegirth unto my daug the Charity Lapelle my
negro girl named Hannah to her this his forever

Item I give thegirth unto my son Paul Patrall one nego
girl named Palmer & one whip saw to him this his
forever

Item I give thegirth unto my son Ephraim Patrall one nego
girl named Mary to him this his forever

Item I give thegirth unto my son John Patrall my plantation
wherever I now live containing fifty two acres

also my grist mill by me In St. Barnabas and my grist
mill Daniel Patrall have all this grain ground Collyea
among other things in reach of the mill my son John to receive
the gift when my wife is dead and it shall stay to John
and his heirs forever

Item I give thegirth unto my son John Patrall an hundred
fifty acres of land lying the remainder part of my property
woods same to him this his forever

Item I give thegirth unto my son John Patrall my more
part East Wall & ditch to him this his forever

Item I give thegirth unto my daughter Charity Patrall my

negro girl named Lydia to her this his forever

Item I give thegirth unto my son Lawrance Patrall wherein

my son Ephraim formerly did lie fifty acres of land also
one hundred fifty acres of land adjoining Gabery prop-
erty to him this his forever also two & one half acre Burwell going
to him this his forever also my Black Smith tools to my
son Lawrance and his heirs forever also my mare called
pleasant Sociale Bridle to my son Lawrance

Item I give thegirth unto my Grand Son Daniel Patrall his

hundred acres of land wherein his father died lies also one

negro woman named Eliza only for my Grandson Nathan
Patrall to have the first being Child she bears & then to
Daniel & his heirs forever also my grand son Daniel
Patrall one mare called Fly, one Cow & Calf and two &
Lands one arading horse & acre

Item I give thegirth unto my two Grand children them

Adam & Elizabeth Adam fifty pounds to be equally divided
between them & their increase if any of them no gift

Item I give thegirth unto my daughter Martha Patrall
one negro girl named Emma also one horse called
Spark one saddle Bridle to her this his forever
as far the remainder part of my Estate within does not
without does I give to my daughter Martha Patrall
and her heirs forever

and I do appoint my thirs sons Thomas Patrall John
Patrall & Paul Patrall to be my executors of this my last
will & testament, reserving & retaining back all other
wills as settled this Sixteenth day of November 1788.

Hart Arthur Will

In the name of God amen. I Arthur Hart of this County
& in Northampton County being in perfect sense & memory do
ordain this my last will & Testament in order & manner
as followeth.

Now, I give & bequeath to my son Warren Hart the plantation
he now lives on and two Negroes Sam'l & Charly to him
this & his successors.

Now, I give & bequeath to my son Harry Hart the plantation
he now lives on & two negroes slaves & fracto to him this
his forever.

Now, I give & bequeath to my son Wright & all the plantation
I now live on containing 476 acres of our Negroe & white
slaves, Jacob Ephraim & Charly two cows & Cales,
slaves & white mouth slaves & twelve head of hogs
& one further Do. of hares to him this his forever.

Now, I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Hart five
negroes, Isaac, Anthony, Peter, Jack & Willy to him this
his forever.

Now, I give & bequeath to my son Isham Hart all my property
wood land on the north side of your-hove Caley Sheller
valley, Iude & R. no less boy fittys four hundred
head over the 80 & two ampt one hundred & a unitare four
head of young cattle to him this his forever.

Item, I give begin with to my son Arthur Hart children of the
said Shelling to be equally divided between them
Item, I leave to my loving wife Martha Hart two negroes fracto
& one during of her widow hood & one boy horse five head
of cattle one Bush & furniture & two lowest cattle piggz
Item, I leave as the remainder of my estate let it consist
of what it will to be equally divided between my first child
drown & living at ye time I do appoint my son Warren Hart
Hart & Wright Hart my executors of this my last
will of habement & witness my hand seal this 22nd day of
October 1785.

In the name of God Amen. I Wright Hart of North
Carolina in Northampton County being in perfect
sense & memory do ordain this my last will & testament
in order as followeth.

Now, I give & bequeath unto myself Boykin my plantation
I now live on containing six hundred & seventy six acres of
land & seven negroes, Dick, Charly, Lucy, Jack, Judie,
Jack Ephraim & Charly and all my stock consisting of Hogs
Cattle Sheep & Hogs and all my house hold furniture
and all the rest of my property let it consist of what it will
in doory & out doors to her & her heirs forever
And I do appoint John Boykin Harting Boykin my executors
of this my last will & testament
